Her silver crown was not in evidence but a fragrant nosegay retained a prominent place on the kitchen table, a reminder of the joy that had been hers at the midnight hour, Friday. A panel of five judges had selected her as the 1968 student queen of Markham Dist. High School.

"I still can't believe it," she said, "It's a wonderful thrill."

Heather, in her Grade 13 year, was crowned by the queen of 1967, Eileen Winch. Here attendants were Vicki Kennedy and Mary Sissons. Her escort for the evening was Stephen Schroeter, an honor graduate of Markham High and now enrolled in his third year at the University of Waterloo.

Without doubt, Heather must be the busiest teenager in Ontario and certainly in Unionville. She enjoys being busy.

Music, both vocal and instrumental, is her first love. She can play the violin, the guitar and the drums. She's a member of the high school band, one of the best in its class in the province.
