John Maxwell, assistant advertising manager of The Tribune, will drive his high-speed go-kart in The Telegram Trophy Race at Mosport, June 15.

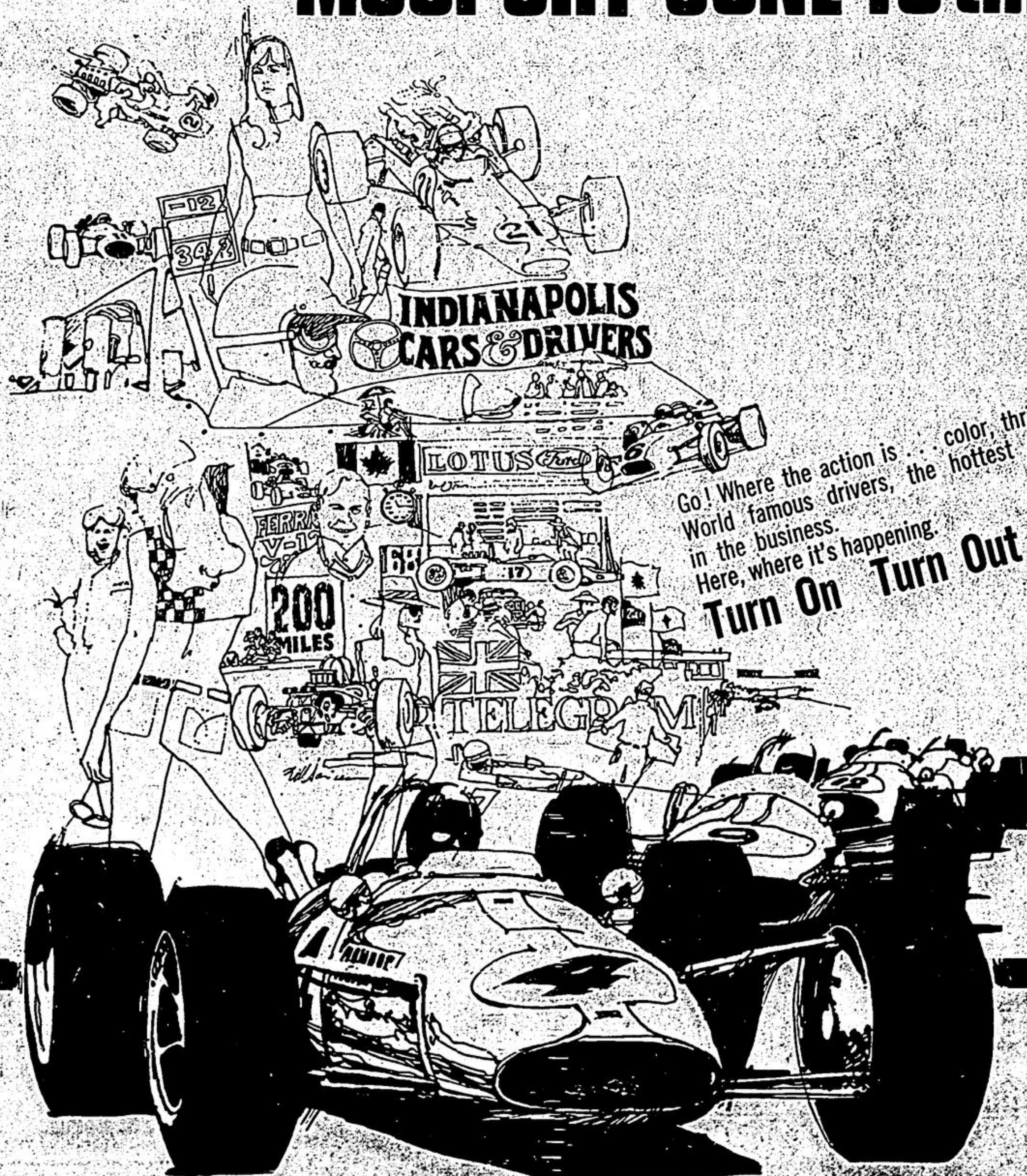
### VILLAGE OF STOUFFVILLE NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS TO DESTROY WEEDS

Notice is hereby given to all persons in possession of land in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O., 1960, C427, Section 3, 13, and 19, that unless noxious weeds growing on their lands within the Village of Stouffville are destroyed by the twenty-first day of June, 1965, and throughout the season as often as it is necessary to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the municipality may enter upon the said lands and have the weeds destroyed, charging the cost against the owner, and collecting in like manner as for municipal taxes.

The co-operation of all citizens is earnestly solicited.
