Traffic signals - \$1,500

STOUFFVILLE — The cost of erecting traffic signal lights at the intersection of Main, Mill and Market Streets in Stouffville has been estimated at \$1,500.

Councillor Tom Lonergan said he had been in touch with the Dept. of Highways on the matter but was not personally convinced that automatic signals would solve the problem. He said that northbound motorists, required to stop on the incline at Market Street, would have trouble moving on the "green" if the road was snow-packed or icy during the winter months. He said, too, that some drivers, in an effort to by-pass the lights would go south on O'Brien and return to Main Street via the Civic Square. Councillor Lonergan said the Department was opposed to hand operated signals and

the few still in use would soon be replaced.

Mr. Lonergan expressed skepticism concerning the safety of legalized crosswalks. He said that according to statistics, the accident rate was high until the public became accustomed to their proper use. In Toronto, he said, many pedestrians invite injury by stepping out from the curb directly into the path of traffic, without giving motorists an opportunity to stop.

At the present time Stouffville has two "courtesy walks" between Market and Civic Streets, but drivers are not required to stop at these locations and pedestrians advance at their own risk.
