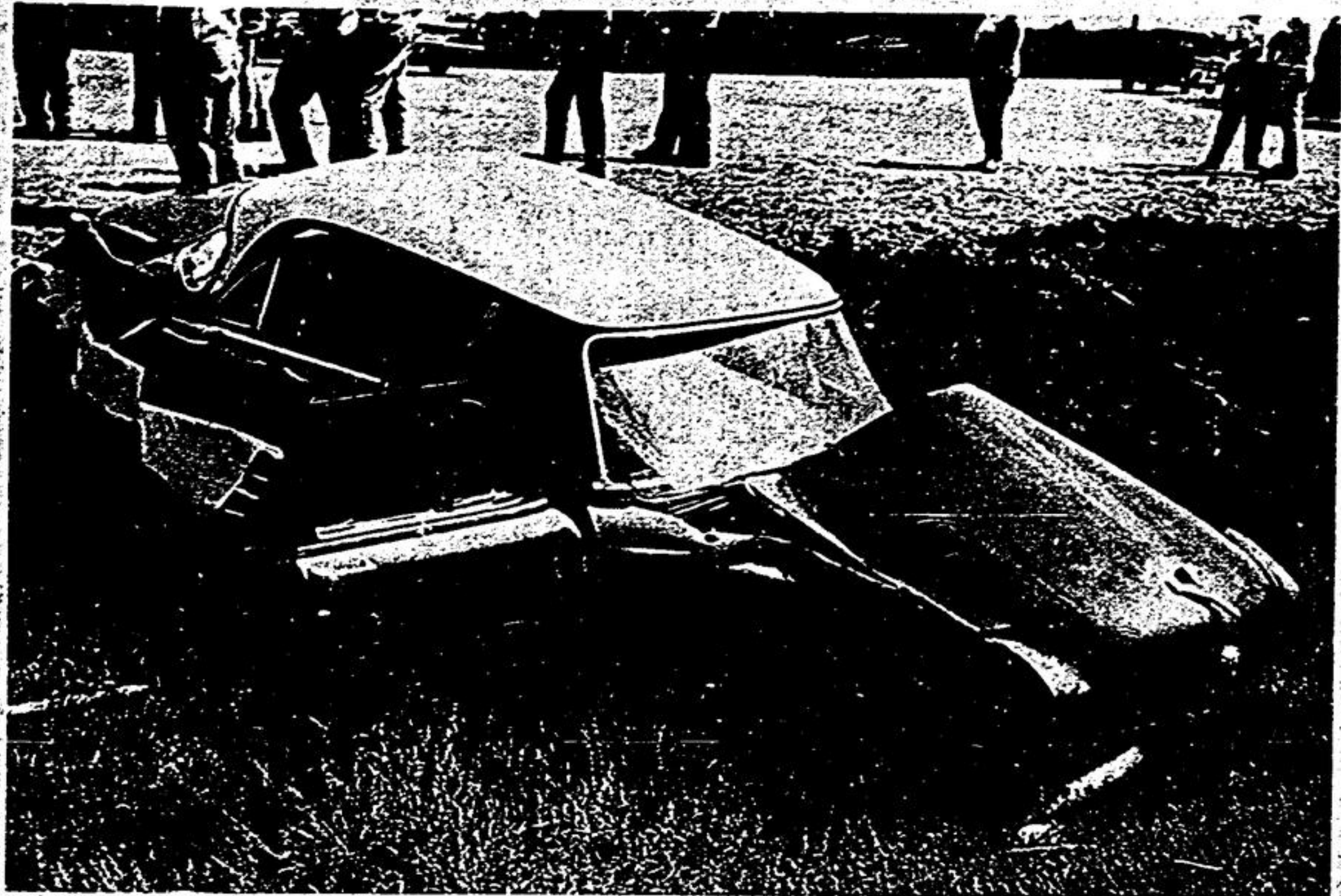
Was veteran of R.C.A.F.
