GORMLEY — Following a short illness Mrs. Daniel Fennell passed away at York County Hospital Newmarket, July 17.
 Born Emma French, May 26, 1873 at Ashburton, South Devon, England, she came to Toronto in 1899 to reside with her sister and brother-in-law, the late Mr. and Mrs. Richard Pengilly.
 After a summer spent in Muskoka and a visit to her family in England in 1902 Mrs. French returned to Canada to marry Mr. Daniel Fennell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Fennell, of Brackenrig, one of the pioneer families of Muskoka. They made their home at Glen Orchard, Mr. Fennell passed away on April 12, 1954.
 After his death Mrs. Fennell lived with her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. J. Allan Pope, of Gormley.
 She enjoyed returning each summer to Glen Home Hotel, Glen Orchard for a holiday and a renewal of old friendships and acquaintances. For the last few months, Mrs. Fennell had resided at Parkview Home, Stouffville.
 The funeral took place at Glen Orchard United Church on Saturday, July 20, with interment in the adjoining cemetery.
