These matches will be held on Les Fermes Miron on the Montreal-Lachute highway (Route No. 8) on Oct. 2, 3 and 4, 1968.

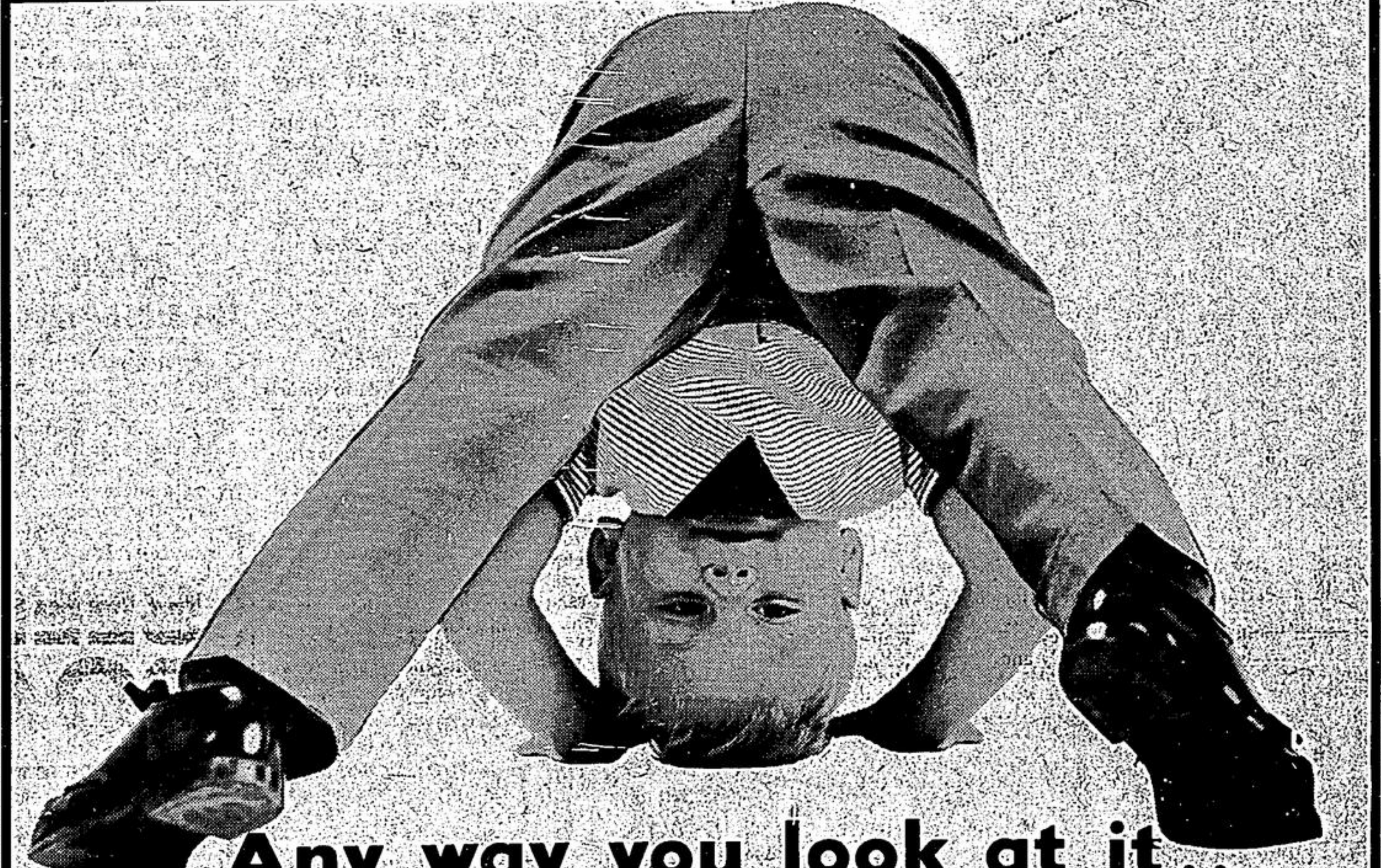
Deer attends school

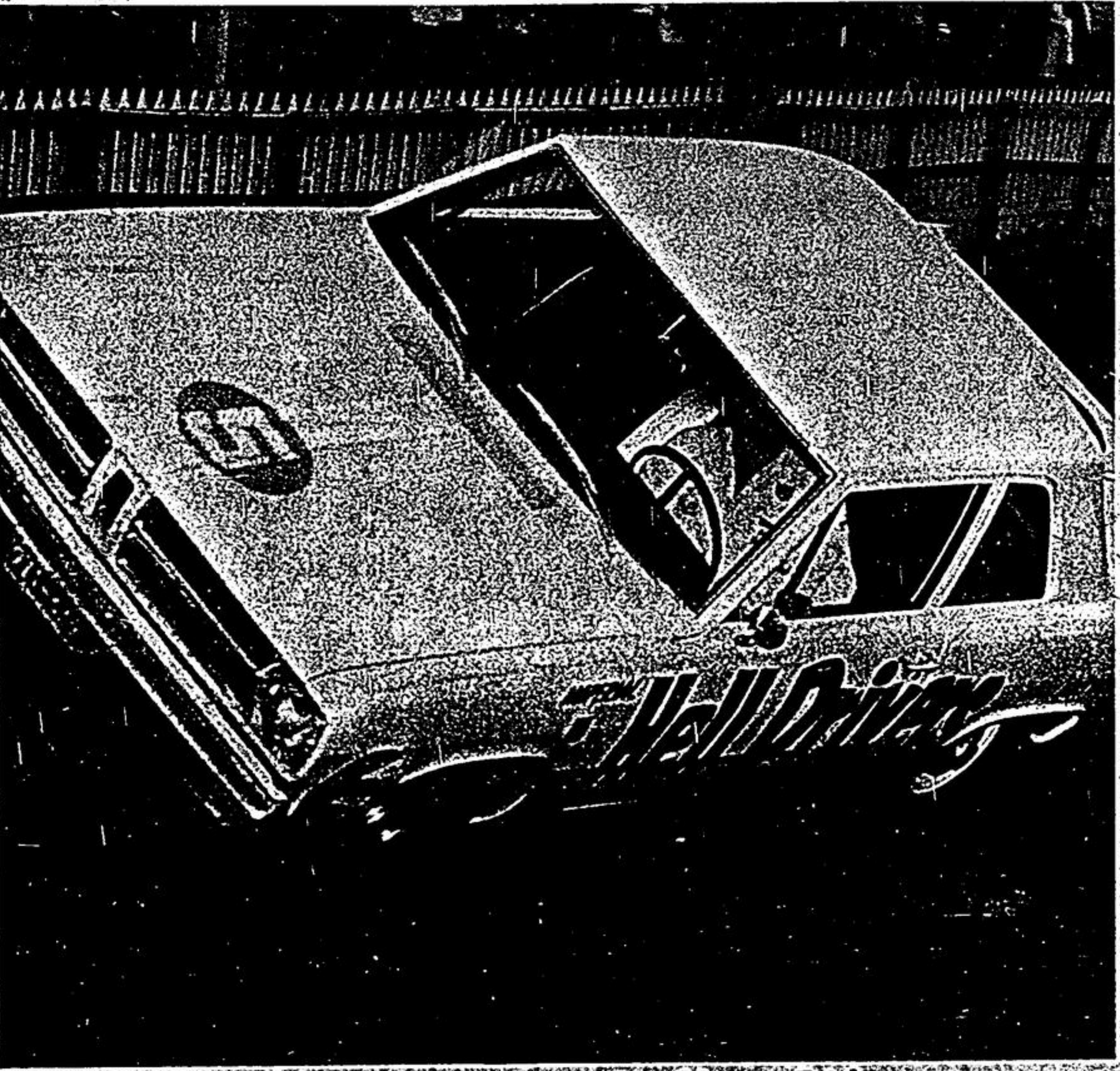
