Ontario County

Retains 'private' health unit

ONTARIO COUNTY — Ontario County Council has rejected a proposal to study further the benefits of joining the York-Oshawa Health Unit now operating with the blessing of the Ontario Department of Health. The amalgamation of York and Ontario Counties with the City of Oshawa had been recommended by Ontario County Warden, Ross Murison. "It appears to me this County does not want to save money," he said, "the provincial bill to provide extra votes for certain municipalities cost about \$1,500. I feel little was accomplished as a result of that expenditure. If we do not join the district

there will be more money down the drain before the end of the year. We were offered an increase in the subsidy if we entered the 3-unit district. I feel we have let the people down." Warden Murison recalled that in February, about \$20,000 had been cut off the Health Unit budget in anticipation of joining the York-Oshawa program by June. He suggested that it would be difficult to get through the year on the funds allocated. "It would be nice to have another \$90,000," he said, "let's get back some of our own money from the government." Deputy-reeve D. L. Hall

of Uxbridge Town suggested that Ontario County would have to examine its position to see just how long it would remain practical to stay out. Reeve, W. H. Gould of Uxbridge said in his opinion the County Unit was operating in an efficient manner and no change should be considered at present. Deputy-reeve, W. W. Stitt of Rama Township said he had no fault to find with the efficiency of the County Unit but noted that many people were not completely satisfied with the service rendered.

Twp. of Pickering

Amalgamation with metro

PICKERING TWP. — Councillor John Kruger's notice of motion for Pickering to amalgamate with Metro Toronto will be voted upon at the first council meeting in December.

He said that the notice of motion had crystallized the position of this area. "It is certainly not my wish to put it forward to force any untoward movement without research," he said. "I see no reason why it should not go forward, but am willing to see that something in a planning way that we may have missed be studied."

"This," he continued, "is a vital question. I think everybody should have their say in it."

Reeve John Williams said there were a number of other considerations, but at the same time, he didn't want to lose any time on it. He thought the

examination could continue, and by December, council would be in a position "to have the machine moving and everything falling into place."

Mr. Kruger explained that the point of the notice was to get the matter out of the political arena. He said that at the Oshawa regional government meeting on Oct. 19, he expected to be quite vocal. Referring to a county council meeting, deputy-reeve Ron Chatten said that some of the members expressed some concern on how slowly the county was moving in this direction and concern that Pickering would be lost to the county. It was felt that if Pickering Township and Village and Ajax removed themselves from the county, 45 percent of the assessment would be gone.

The County Matters

Committee, he said, was authorized to make a specific study of regional government.

A private remark made to him at the county meeting was that the county should be inducing Pickering to stay.
