# Whitby here for home opener Nov. 5

## Eight team league

Stouffville, Whitby, Cobourg, Little Britain, Sunderland, Haliburton, Woodville and Keswick — these are the centres that will be represented in the Intermediate O.H.A. league this winter.

The Clippers league opener is at Cobourg Sunday, Oct. 27. They will play host to a strong contingent from Whitby, Nov. 5. All home games will be on Tuesday nights in the Stouffville Arena.

In preparation for these games, coach Don Haynes has increased his roster by six players. Goalies Glenn Jackson and Dennis Forsyth are in the fold along with Geoff Gaston, Carl Keffer and Bob Smith. Former Leaf forward, Bob Hassard has also affixed his signature to a Clipper contract.

In the recent Sunday and Tuesday workouts the "old boys" have continued to show "kids" how to illuminate the scoreboard. The veterans have yet to leave a scrimmage on the short end of the goal tally. A turn-out of twenty-four players at Tuesday's trial suggests the determination of the unsigned players to find a berth on this club.

Arrangements are being made for an exhibition game with Whitby here Tuesday, but at press time plans were still not definite.

The club has now been cut to sixteen players. John Maxwell is currently handling the coaching chores but Jake Harman will take over the reins in a few weeks.

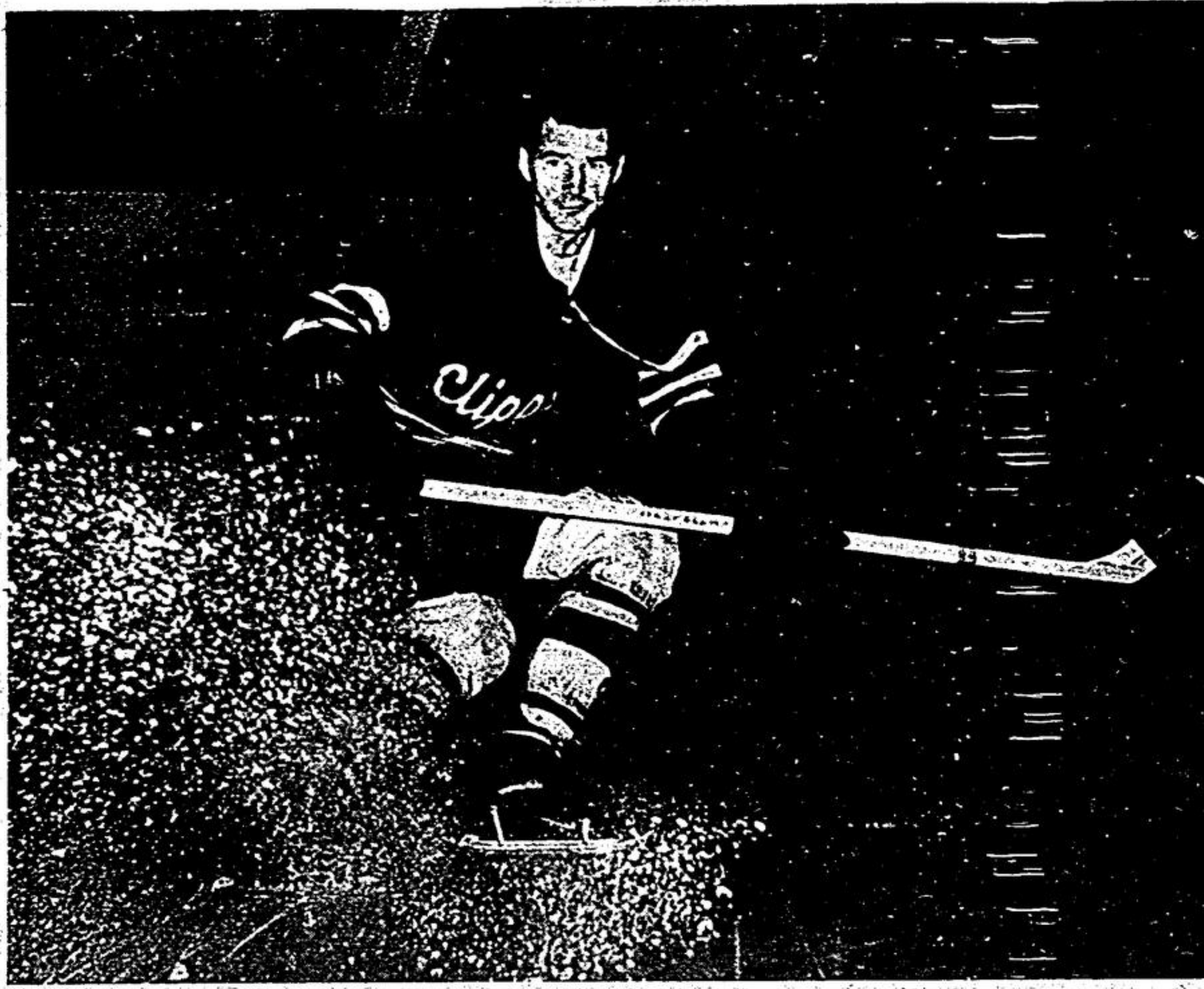
