**Uxbridge ratepayers  
New executive**

UXBRIDGE TWP. — There was an encouraging attendance at a special meeting of the Uxbridge Township Ratepayers' Association, Oct. 29.

Ron Adkin, in addressing the gathering, charged that the present executive had failed to supply the drive and leadership necessary to install confidence among the electorate. He said that unless renewed enthusiasm was apparent, the association could die.

Mr. Adkin said that the only purpose of the association was not to bring pressure to bear on council when a particular problem arose, but rather a body to work in co-operation with council and act

as a liaison between the ratepayers and the administration. "Supplying constructive criticism if and when required is necessary", he said, "but most important of all is the task of keeping a finger on the pulse of the people".

Mr. Adkin said that a ratepayers' association could serve a very worthwhile purpose in a changing community and he urged its continuance.

Those present gave his remarks enthusiastic support. The new executive includes the following members: President, Roy Hammond; vice president, Ron Weller; secretary-treasurer, Cyril Vincent; members at large, Darcy Higgins, Keith Barrie, Jim Baily and Ron Adkin.

The date and time for taking the vote will be Monday, December 2, 1968, and polls will be open from 10 o'clock a.m. to 8 o'clock p.m.
