

Markham whips Weston 8-3

MARKHAM — Markham Junior 'B' fans had much to cheer about Friday night.

In direct contrast to their uninspired performance of the previous week, Bonello's boys put on a spectacular show as they dumped the Weston 'Dodgers' 8-3.

The 'Seal-A-Wax' sextet struck early — 32 seconds early — and then did an encore 22 seconds later. Two goals in the first minute of play. They never looked back.

Steve Coates of the local squad was the star performer with a hat-trick. It wasn't just an ordinary hat-trick. He scored 3 consecutive goals. One was unassisted.

During the first period, Markham earned three tallies to the 'Dodgers' one. Graham Wise drew first blood after being assisted by Harry Head and Steve Vickers. Seconds later, Steve Vickers came back and set up Paul Roueff for a close-in shot. Weston made the score sheet as Dusty Paphé made good use of assists from Murray Hagggett and Bob Murphy to flip the puck past Rick Johnston in the Markham nets. At the 15:05 mark Steve Coates of the home team ended the scoring in the second frame.

Several minutes later he slapped home his third marker with Jim Winter-son's aid.

The Wise-Vickers-Head trio which sparked throughout the game combined again, this time Graham Wise lighting the red bulb behind the Weston goal.

The final counter of the second period came off the stick of Weston's Steve McDonald after a pass from Hal Murphy.

During the last period, Markham sprinkled more salt in the Weston wounds with two more tallies. While John Noble cooled his heels in the penalty box Peter Maryschak scored from Steve Vickers and Chris Meloff. Then it was Graham Wise again from Steve Vickers for Markham. The period ended after Weston's Ian Douglas made it 3-3 with help from Jim Wilson and Allen Morello.

During the contest the 'Seal-A-Wax' crew was assessed 7 penalties and the Dodgers were rapped for 10.

The pace throughout the entire game was fast and at times furious but the Weston warriors had difficulty clearing the puck from their own end and failed to mount anything resembling a concerted attack. On the other hand, the Markham team played as a unit as their passes clicked and their back-checking put the losers off stride.

Graham Wise and Steve Coates made the big difference as they connected for six of Markham's goals.

models. All the participants and spectators felt the evening was very successful. The ladies also held a successful Hallow'en dance, November 2 and are planning to have a bazaar and bake sale






