STOUFFVILLE — How can a critic criticize perfection? The answer — he can't.

The Stoffville Players' presentation of 'The First Fish' at the Legion Hall, Nov. 21 and 22, came as close to a professional performance as any amateur organization will ever achieve.

Crowd wise, it deserved a better fate. Although the rather sparse audience, Thursday, was replaced by an improved attendance, Friday, the box office support still fell far short of former years.

The story was centred around the desire of a distraught wife, Sylvia Barr (Mary Harris) to restore her husband's self-confidence. Phil Barr was played by Frank Mellon. To accomplish this feat, Sylvia asks a close friend, Jerry Hubley (Frank Steele) to obtain the services of a professional call girl, Lee Carole (Elsa Bevan). Sylvia nobly arranges a "chance" meeting between her husband and Miss Carole. A serious situation develops when Phil becomes infatuated with Lee and Sylvia fears that their marriage is headed for the rocks.

Further complications occur when Jerry's bride-to-be, Helen Whitney (Teresa Foulds) visits Sylvia's home to announce her forthcoming marriage and finds Jerry there with both Sylvia and Lee.

Mary Harris as the distraught housewife was brilliant. In fact, her part was without doubt, the best performance in a female role; ever played by a member of the Players organization. The audience, caught up in both the drama and the comedy of her part, reacted with appreciative applause and laughter. She had a volume of lines to learn and it was obvious she had learned them well. In spite of the sometimes seriousness of her role, nothing was lost. Every word was spoken distinctly and with feeling.
