## Will direct own destiny - Rumble

MARKHAM TWP. — Reeve Stewart Rumble, entering his third campaign for the Reeve's chair in Markham Twp., told ratepayers at a packed nominations meeting at Buttonville Nov. 18, that after the municipality's two year Council "our affairs are in order and our future is clear."

"We have kept a close eye on the mill rate," he told the audience, adding that the mill rate over which Markham Twp. and the County has control has dropped noticeably since 1966: from 46 mills in 1966, to 41.5 mills in 1968.

Mr. Rumble stressed the importance of municipal representation on County Council, and said that York County affairs are becoming increasingly vital in the township, with the imminency of a County Board of Education.

Last year he reminded ratepayers, a regional Health and Welfare unit was formed with headquarters at Oshawa of which he is chairman.

Amalgamation appeared to be the shadow which dogged most speakers at the meeting.

Mr. Rumble said he is interested that Markham Twp. "will develop in an orderly fashion with your interests in mind." "It is no wonder," he continued, "that other municipalities look to our broad lands with covetous eyes." However, he said he believes Markham Twp. can and will direct its own destiny.

Again speaking about amalgamation, Mr. Rumble said "Thornhill has indicated they are interested. He said Markham Twp. has already considered possibilities, particularly with Markham Vil-

lage and in the matter of police protection: "We have provided leadership to the Southern Six in seeking amalgamation of police forces, and as late as a week ago have heard the Ontario Police Commission recommend this," said Mr. Rumble. He also stated that during his reeve'ship, fire protection services have been improved in co-operation with Vaughan.

Regarding Regional Government, another suggestion in the wind, Mr. Rumble said is a provincial decision.

Concluding his five-minute speech Reeve Rumble said that "in 1969 if elected, he would be a top contender for Warden in York County."

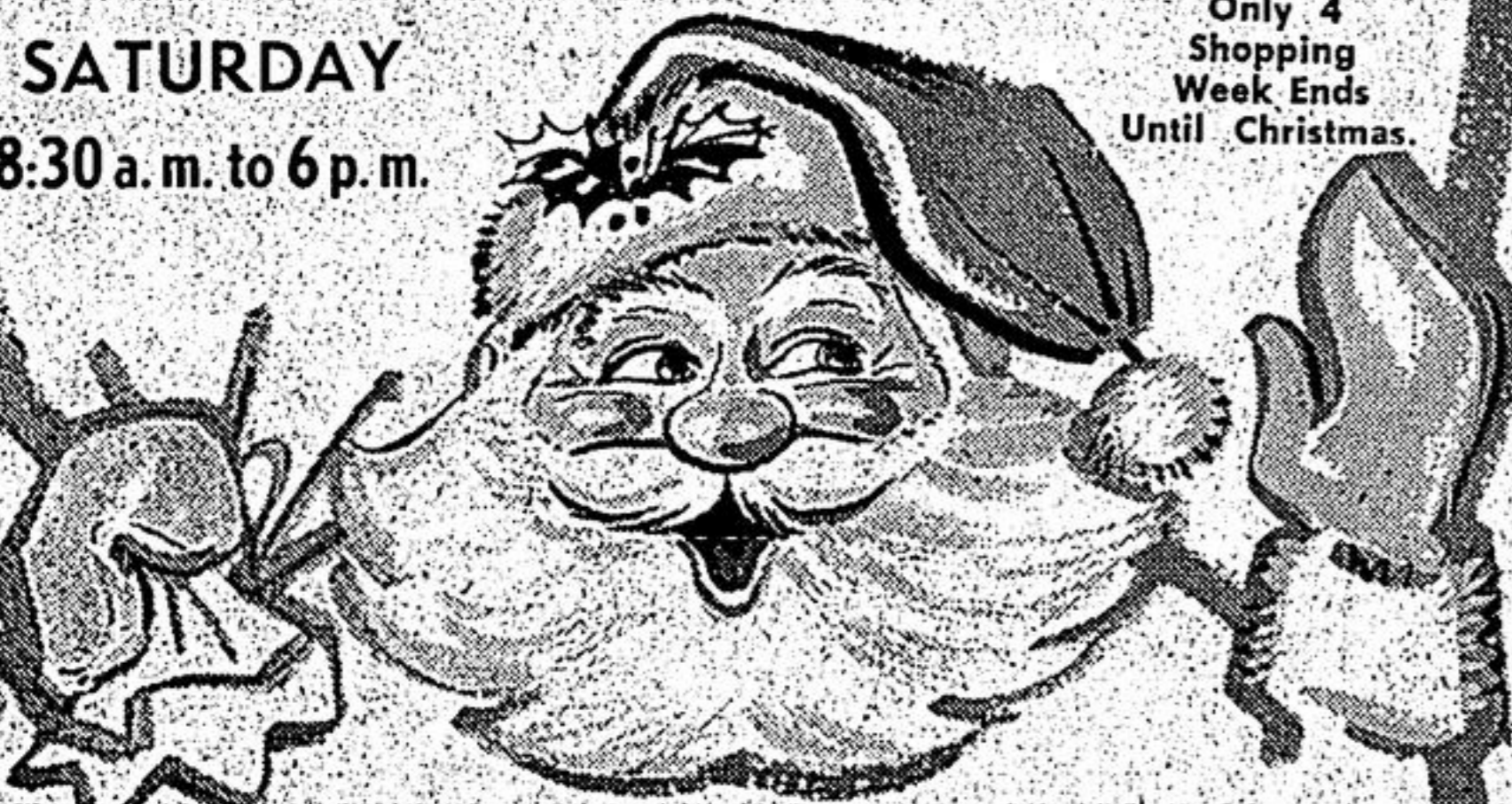

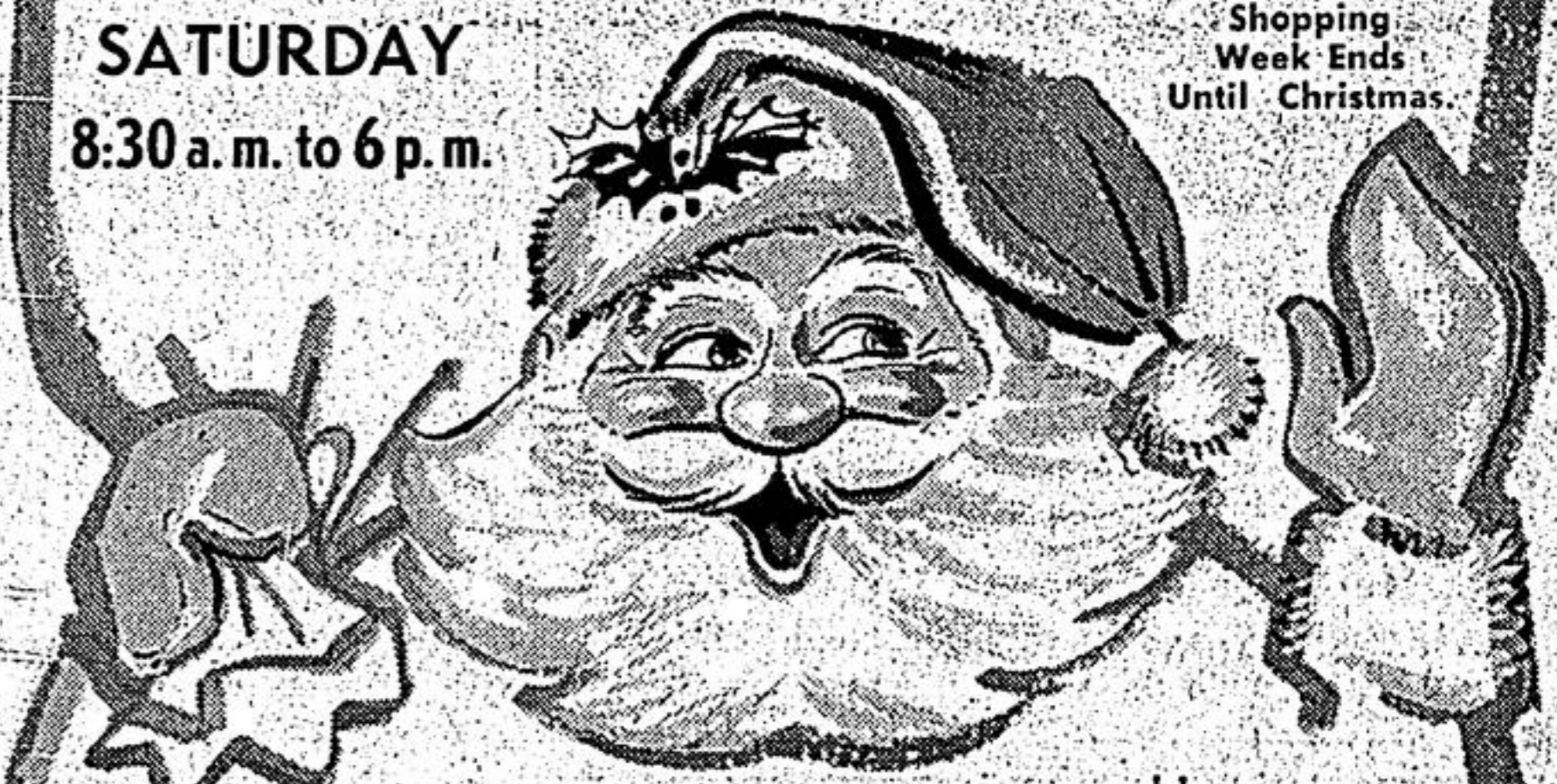
