## From the minister's study

 The hardest nut to crack this Christmas will not be a hazel nut or a Brazil nut. It will be the Virgin Birth of Christ. Some people don't want to think much about it; some face it, then reason it away; still some reason it into its proper place.  
 But what do you think about it? Let me ask this: Why don't we celebrate the birth of Aristotle, Plato or Einstein, all great men of the past? What is so special about this other great man in history, called Jesus Christ? Here it is. — The Virgin Birth.  
 "But it couldn't happen," you say. "Every single law of nature is against it." Right! I believe in nature, too. But I wouldn't go so far as to say that we should let nature take its course. I had to weed my garden this year; nature was against me. There were some cases of rape in the papers lately, partly because some people felt that nature should take its course. I'm afraid nature can be cruel at times, don't you?  
 It seems to me that something has gone wrong with nature somewhere along the line.  
 You see, my friends, the whole matter of the birth of Jesus Christ without the natural aid of a male human rests upon what you think of God and the present nature of things.  
 For many thinking people, God has been creating babies for years. Don't you believe it when some proud father tells you that he created that new baby of his. He had very little to do with it, and what he had to do with it was not creative. The whole system of natural birth started long ago by the Originator of all life.  
 Now, the Virgin Birth is a break in the line of natural births. It is different. What God had been doing for thousands of years He did in a new way this time. This time it was special, because the baby to be born was special. He was the TRUE Son of God, born without the aid of any man. That is why Christmas is so special to people who believe.

## Centennial project completed

BLOOMINGTON — Recently a Centennial project became a reality, when a sign reading "Bloomington Methodist Cemetery" was erected at the north cemetery, east of the four corners.  
 The sign is a wrought iron structure in black, with letters in gold. It was assembled by Walt Smith of Stouffville. Mr. Smith donated his time and labour to the project.  
 Many donations were received, which helped to make a dream come true for a group of girls who formed a Sunday School Class almost fifty years ago, under the Leadership of the late Mrs. Edgar Story. The church where the class was held, stood at the east side of the cemetery, but this was removed in 1939 after being sold.  
 Three years ago, a reunion was held in Stouffville Park by all members of the original class and it was decided to erect a sign, in honour of the highly respected Bloomington citizens who are laid to rest in the little country cemetery.  
 Recently a Bee was held and the sign was put in place with the help of Mr. M. Barnes, Murray Ramer, Warren Rae and Eldon Smith.

The ladies of the original Sunday School Class, now all married, are — Mrs. Ed. Logan, Mrs. M. Ramer, Mrs. I. Smith, Mrs. W. Rae, Mrs. O. Harding, Mrs. E. Davis, Mrs. H. Swain, Mrs. W. Claughton and Mrs. E. Canning.

## Editor's mail

Dear Sir:  
 For the past several weeks we have been reading in our newspapers of the tremendous opposition from residents of the surrounding communities to the proposed enlargement of Toronto International Airport.  
 Residents of Etobicoke, Mississauga, Brampton, and other Peel County communities have been holding dozens of crowded meetings to register their protests, and have even sent a delegation to Ottawa, and one to Queen's Park, to express their opposition to this project.  
 These people oppose enlargement of the existing airport because they are already only too familiar with the tremendous noise and nuisance created by the big jets landing and taking off at Toronto Airport. Many residents, living miles from the airport, but on one of the flight paths, claim that they can't get a night's sleep because of the roar of the jets. They fear that enlarging this airport, together with the increased air traffic expected and the advent soon of the new "Jumbo Jets" will make their lives altogether intolerable.  
 Much of the great residential buildup in the areas affected by Toronto International Airport has occurred since that airport was built. Presumably, then, most of the residents now in those areas did have the opportunity to learn what they were getting themselves into before they moved there.  
 Now we in the area east of Metro Toronto have last week's press release from Ontario Riding M.P. Norm Cafik, in which he says that he has suggested to the Federal Minister of Transport, Mr. Hellyer, that instead of enlarging Toronto International, a new airport be built in Ontario Riding. He goes on to say that he thinks such an airport "would be a great boon to the area."  
 "Misery indeed" loves company. Evidently our Liberal M.P. feels that he

can make a contribution to his constituency by suggesting that the misery surrounding Toronto International Airport be divided up so that we can enjoy our share of it. Thus helping Mr. Hellyer out of the corner he is backed into.  
 With the evidence right before us in the daily reports of the controversy surrounding the proposed enlargement of Toronto Airport, I hope the residents of our area are not going to be taken in by
