Uxbridge policy plan

UXBRIDGE TWP. — Almost overnight the Township of Uxbridge has become a proposed site for several major projects.

To deal with these and other pending problems, including regional government, the council will hold a special committee meeting, Jan. 20.

Priority will be given to discussions on 'Century City' and a proposed International Airport, advocated by Scarborough reeve Ab. Campbell for the Uxbridge area.

Uxbridge members have announced their opposition to the regional government plan although the Minister of Municipal Affairs, Hon. Darcy McKeough has stated that it will become a reality late this year or early in 1970.

Trustees address meeting

MARKHAM — Two representatives on the York County Separate School Board addressed the January meeting of St. Patrick's Catholic Women's League.

Mr. Jack McDermott of Stouffville and Mr. Donald Ferguson of Markham enlightened their listeners on the programs that had been planned for the year ahead. Their remarks were centred around the subject 'Our duties as trustees on your behalf.'

Seek town tavern

MARKHAM — A rezoning application has been received from Northview Restaurants to accommodate a new tavern, steak house and banquet hall on Laidlaw Boulevard, north of Hwy. No. 7 in the Town of Markham.

The request was approved by council Monday and a by-law will be submitted

to the Ontario Municipal Board for sanction. The applicant said that he had personally approached the operators of 25 industries in the area and none had voiced objection. The firm plans to apply for a liquor license. Construction on the site will await a positive reply from the O.M.B.

Sewage flood control

STOUFFVILLE — The next phase of construction at the site of Stouffville's sewage disposal plant, may not be as costly as first anticipated.

The requirements, to accommodate a population of 5,500, are contained in a letter to village council from the Division of Sanitary Engineering of the Ontario Water Resources Commission. It is planned to alleviate the problem of overflow caused by the

runoff of surface water during peak rain periods of the spring and fall.

The recommendations will be discussed at a meeting this month between council and consulting engineer, Murray Barrington of Richmond Hill.

Reeve Ken Laushway said that the addition, as proposed, could serve the village for an additional four years, depending on commercial, industrial and residential growth.

Unfair treatment at county level

PICKERING TWP. — Pickering Twp. deputy-reeve Ronald Chatten has strongly criticized the attitude of rural municipalities and the unfair treatment Pickering receives at the County level.

Speaking at the first meeting of the new year, Jan. 6, deputy-reeve Chatten charged a lack of understanding between rural and urban members.

"Rural representatives have a great fear that they will lose control of their voting majority. They contribute much, less, but jealously guard their voting powers. They do not understand the problems of urban areas and do not want to understand," said Mr. Chatten.

"If anyone doubts our wisdom in attempting to withdraw from the county system, let them attend County Council and see what kind of democracy exists there."
