Mrs. Lewis loves to crochet and knit. A beautiful tablecloth in the dining room was admired as a product of her handiwork.

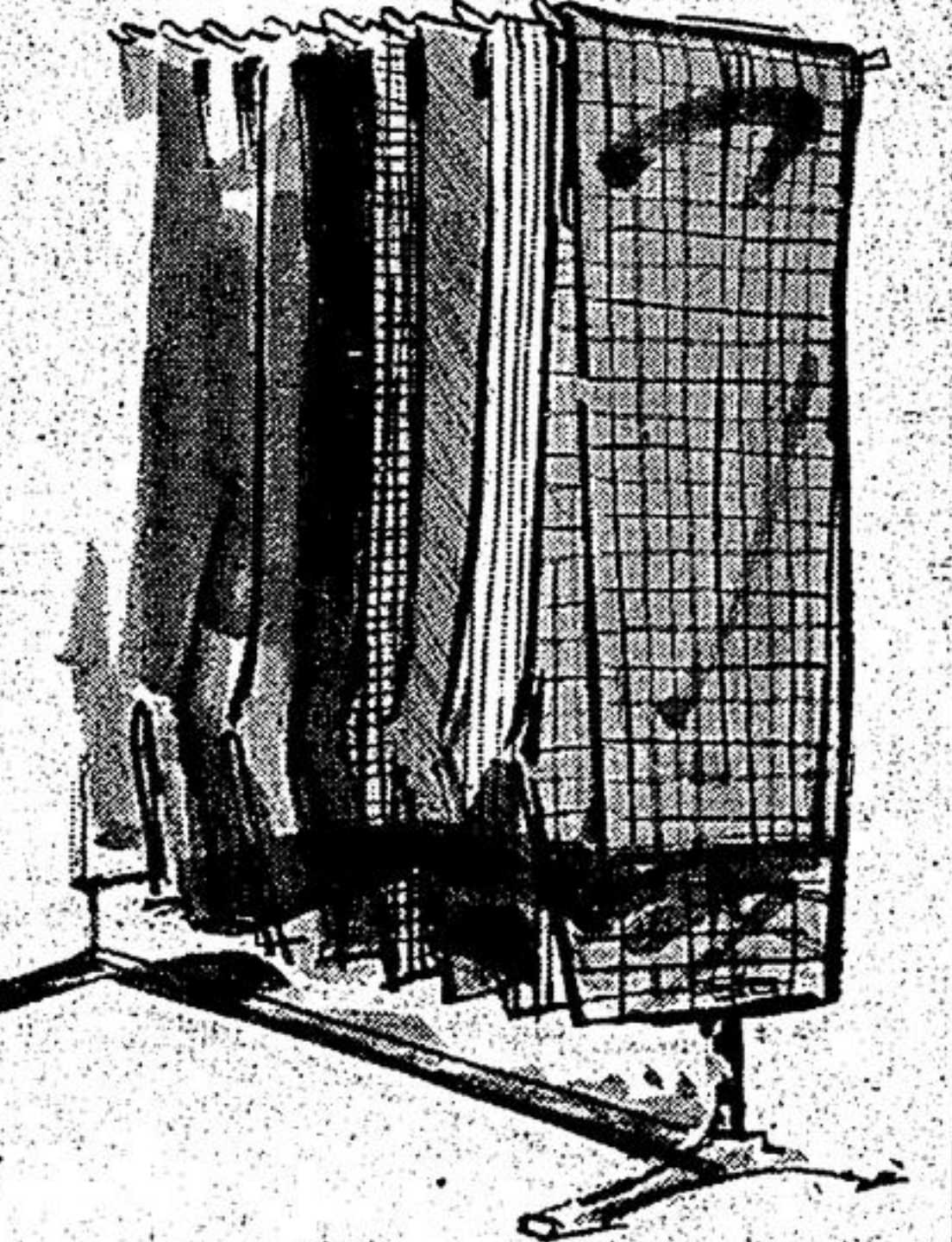
