

# Senior men's bowling league 'a group of good sports'

STOUFFVILLE — So you're 34 and topped 200 in bowling.

So what? What kind of score will you roll when you're 74 or 84 or even older?

On alternate Friday afternoons between Stouffville and Agincourt, a senior citizens' bowling league occupies the alleys and results are amazing. They call themselves 'The Senators.'

As an example of their prowess, Del Jennings at 74 posted a creditable 222 and John Underwood, 83, counted a 202. Albert King this year's president, beats 200 regularly. He is 76. The average age of the participants is 75.

The teams are never the same each week but every one plays, regardless of age, attendance or ability. League secretary, Andy Williams, keeps all the records and awards are made at a banquet arranged at the end of the season. Newt Joynt, that venerable sports promoter from Agincourt, is also on the executive.

Agincourt's Bill Collier is the 'daddy' of them all. He will be 89 on May 1. Not only does he bowl twice a week, he also plays shuffleboard and walks from 5 to 6 miles on week-ends.

A few years off this pace are Ray Fleury and John Underwood, both of Stouffville at 83. How do alley and lawn bowling compare? "Lawn bowling is by far the best game," says Andy Williams, "there's a lot more to it."

The majority of members have been in the league since its inception. Some, however, take a temporary leave of absence in mid-January to enjoy a trip to Florida but most attend regularly.

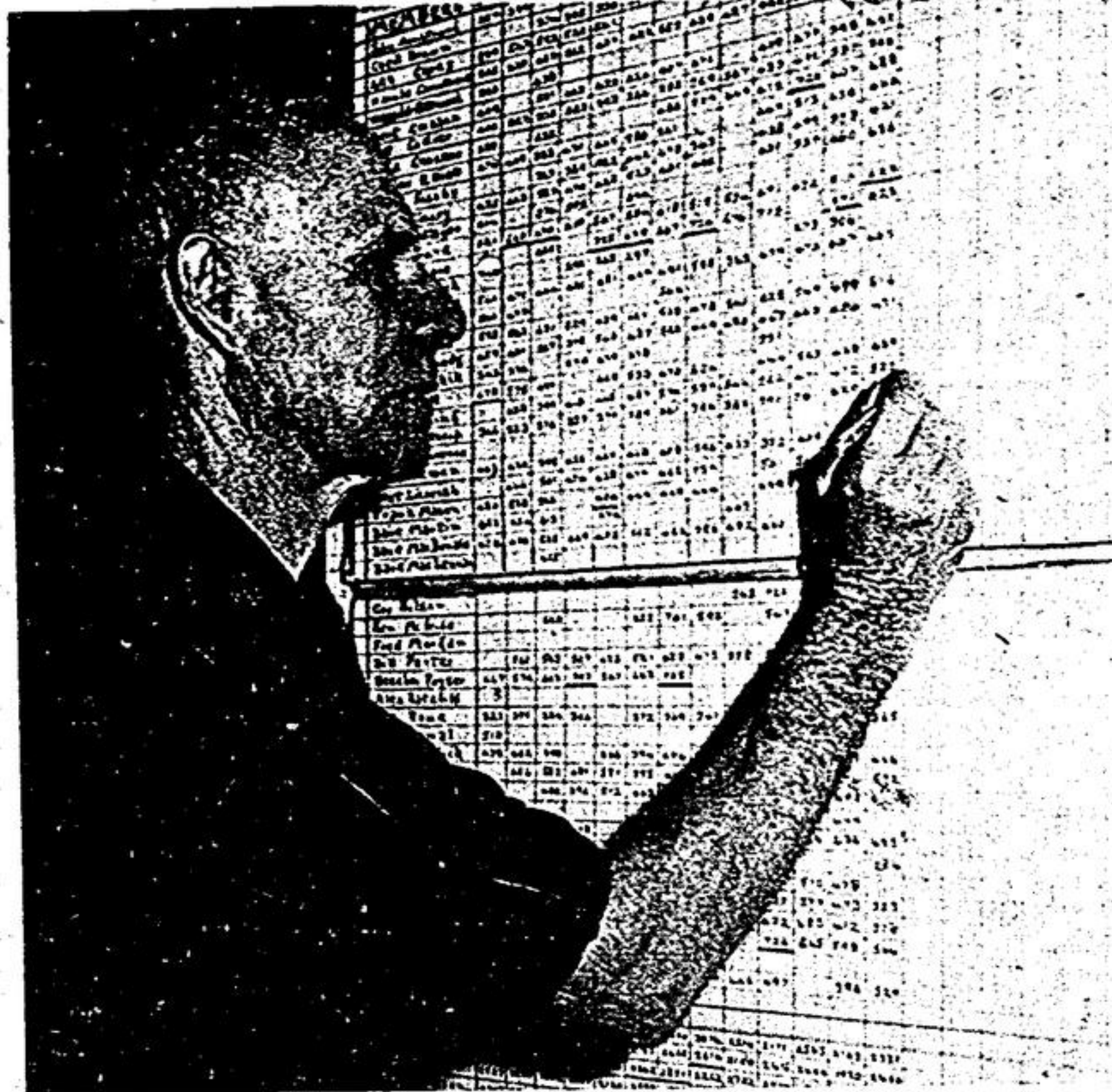
