Mrs. Rose Cole was admitted to Oshawa Hospital Feb. 7 for observation and tests.

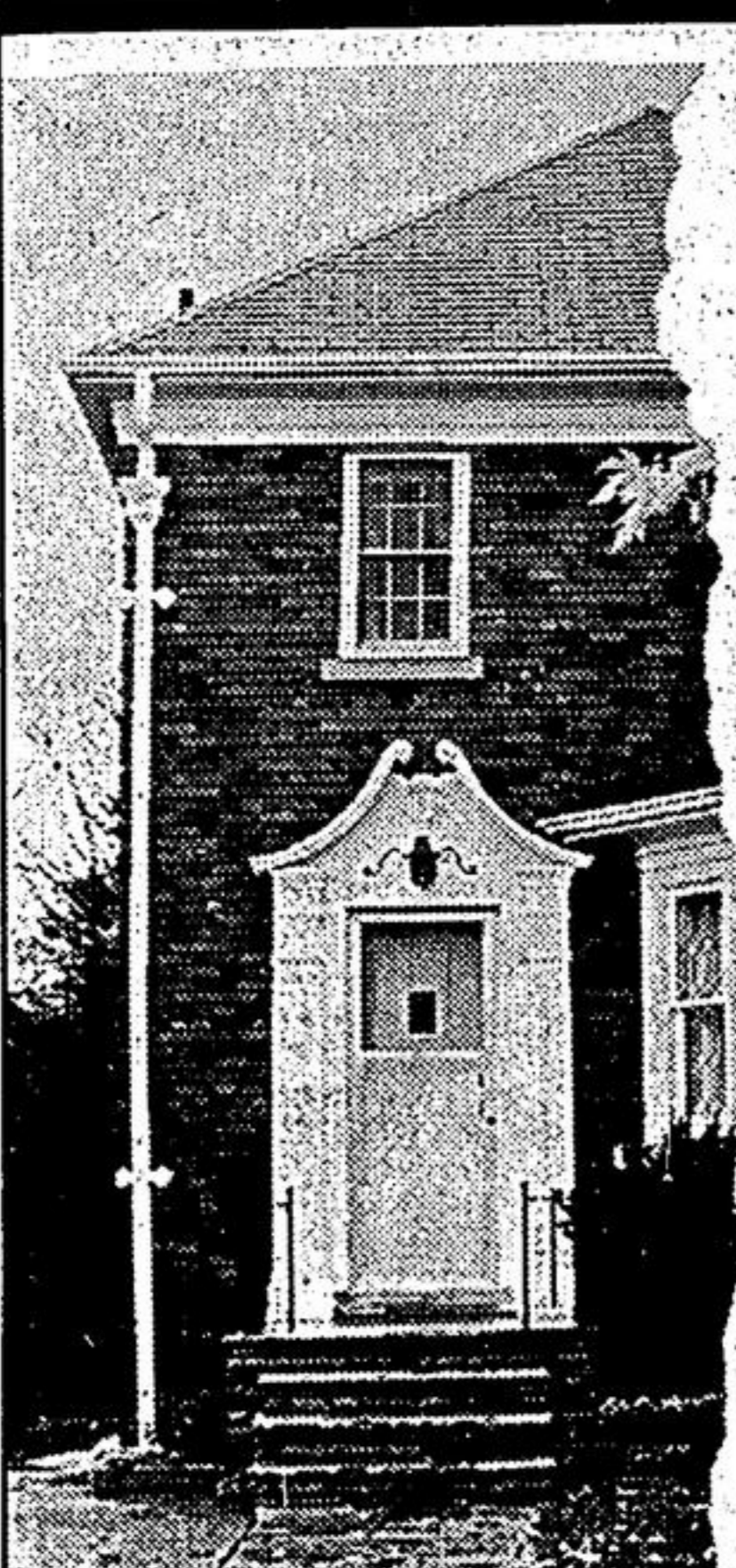
Unit 3 of the U.C.W. met at the home of Mrs. Charles McTaggart.
