## Wrong township

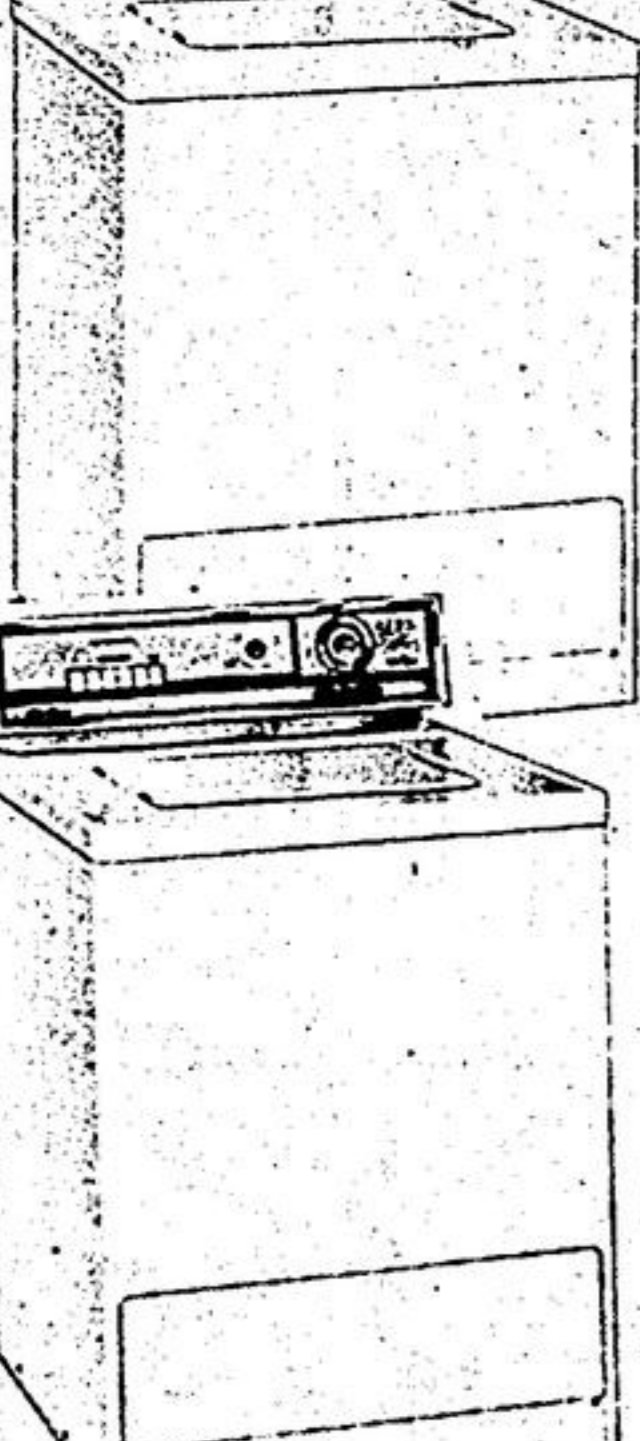

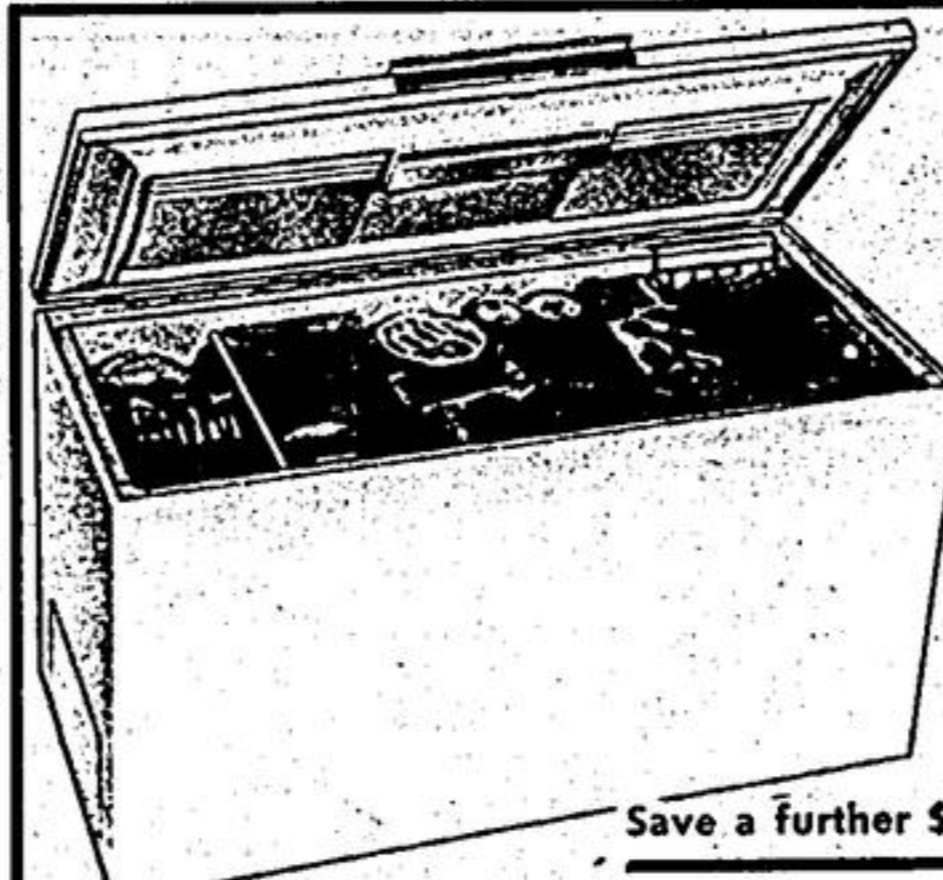
