

WHITCHURCH TWP .sod-turning ceremony will be held June 4 to mark the start on construction of a new precast concrete plant at the intersection of Hwy. 48 and the Bethesda Road in

Whitchurch Twp. The firm, Jespersen-Kay Systems Ltd., with headquarters in Ontario, holds rights to a Danish indus. trialized modular concrete building system for North America, Mexico, the Bahamas and the Caribbean countries.

This will be the company's first Canadian

Wm. B. Kajdosky, president, said that the production of elements for apartment buildings is expected to get under way at the new plant this fall. By making pre-cast con. crete units in a factory and assembling them on the site, apartments can be built faster and at a lower cost.

Mr. Kajdosky said that ' the market value of Jespersen-Kay shares since first introduced in February, 1969 had shown a growth of more than 500 percent.
