

# Horn Elevator firm to relocate plant in Pickering Twp.

**PICKERING TWP.** — Pickering Twp. council and the Horn Elevator Company have jointly announced the largest single industrial proposal in the history of the municipality.

Horn Elevator has purchased the Rootes' Motors plant on Hwy. 2, west of Liverpool Road, which now has a floor area of 31,000 square feet.

Plans call for immediate expansion of an additional 120,000 square feet.

The total investment on the part of Horn represents nearly three million dollars.

Horn is the second largest elevator manufacturer in Canada, employing 1,000 people at its plants in Scarborough and Vancouver, plus branch offices throughout the country.

The entire operation from Scarbro, including the head office and plant, will move to the Pickering location by June, 1970.

Provision has been made for further expansion up to 300,000 square feet.

Bert Mann, president of Horn Elevator, explained the reason for the move to Pickering.

He said that the area offered a good pool of skilled labor, a friendly and receptive council and adequate transportation including truck arteries and rail lines. The greatest reason, however, is the availability of space which will permit the company to increase its export markets, he said.

At present, Horn exports 15 percent of their products but they have plans to sell in the U.S., abroad and in countries behind the iron curtain.

Pickering Twp. has struggled for many years

to attract industrial assessment, according to Reeve John Williams. He stated that prior to 1968, there had been much talk but no action.

It was at that time that council decided to service industrial lands south of Hwy. 2. Since then, he said, the council has been in a position to attract industry.

Reeve Williams said that negotiations are already under way with other companies.

The plant will employ five hundred people.
