Standing room only

Cyclists' day in court

YORK CTY. — Richmond Hill Court was crowded past capacity and many were forced to stand as Provincial Judge Crawford Guest heard a total of 27 charges against 19 members of the Satan's Choice Motorcycle Club, September 25.

The majority of members who appeared were decked out in their club regalia, leather and sleeveless denim jackets, covered with club crests and insignias. One wore a belt fashioned from motorcycle chains. But, their appearance had no bearing on their conduct. Court proceedings went normally with no interruptions.

The scene was a complete about-face from a hearing after a Markham Township Clubhouse, two years ago. At that time members talked, smoked and stomped their feet in court, and outside the building, police officials called on the Richmond Hill fire department to stand by with hoses in case a riot erupted.

Sixteen members were charged, Sept. 21, with being drunk in a public place, by Judge R. G. Graham, in Richmond Hill Court September 26. Ringwood was found in the yard of Markham High School

Kitchener; Murray Blaker, Baltimore, Ontario; and Jon Bakley, Scarboro, pleaded guilty and were fined \$10 or five days. James Ostrom and Kari Greenaway received suspended sentences, and were placed on three-months probation. A bench warrant was issued for two members' arrest. They, along with six others, who pleaded not guilty to the charge, will appear on Oct. 30.

Edward Kane, of Windsor was freed on \$1,000 bail, and will appear again on October 3, to set a date for trial. He has been charged with having a firearm outside of his place of residence or business without a permit, having a weapon dangerous to the public peace, being a found in, and with

drug possession, contrary to the Federal Narcotics Control Act.

Three more men are charged with the same offence under the Narcotics Control Act. Stephen Gauld, Roger Cobiere, and Bruce Bennett will also appear on Oct. 3 to set a date.

Charges were laid following a police raid on the Vaughan Township clubhouse, on Jane Street, where three persons were charged with drinking under age. Fifty officers from Vaughan, King, Richmond Hill, Newmarket, Whitchurch, Markham Twp., Oak Ridges O.P.P., and Metro Toronto took part in the roundup.

Drago Salajko, of Kitchener, pleaded guilty to the drinking charge, and was fined \$25 or 5 days.

Stole radio from store

STOUFFVILLE — A 17 year old Markham Township boy, James Burkholder, R.R. 2, Markham, pleaded guilty to a charge of theft before Judge R. J. Graham, in Richmond Hill Court Sept. 26.

Burkholder and a companion were detained by Stouffville appliance store owner, Doug Neville, after he noticed that a radio transceiver was missing from his store window. The two had been the only customers in the store that morning. The police were called, and Burkholder admitted to Constable Harry Davis that he had taken the unit. It was recovered in a pile of rubble behind the Betz Pools

Eamon Kadustiki had his case remanded until November 6, and Wayne Kelly, of Teston, who pleaded not guilty, will appear on October 30.

office on Market Street. Burkholder's father appeared with him, and told the court that his son had never been in any trouble before. Judge Graham, fined him \$50 or 10 days and made it clear that Burkholder was to pay the fine himself.
