Used Unionville postal box

UNIONVILLE — A 22 year old University of Toronto student, Malcolm Fraser, St. George St., Toronto, was convicted, October 3, in Richmond Hill Court, on a charge of possession of property obtained through fraud. He had pleaded guilty to the charge.

Fraser was arrested, June 26, in the Unionville Post Office, following a lengthy investigation. In his possession were four airline tickets valued at \$1256.00. Thirteen orders for tickets valued at over \$3000.00 were involved in the case.

Using the name of T. J. Markland, Fraser opened a box at the Oak Ridges Post Office in February. Orders for tickets were placed by telephone with several major airlines, using false credit card numbers. The tickets were mailed to the box in Oak Ridges. After a request for tickets to Los Vegas, American Airlines noticed that the credit card number was incorrect. Police were notified, and the Postal Investigation Branch requested the Post Master notify them if any further mail was sent to the box. A note requesting the owner to see the Postmaster before any further mail would be delivered was placed in the box.

Use of the box was discontinued and a second was opened in the Unionville office. Investigators linked the two although the name used in the new box was M. A. Jackson. Detective Sgt. Ronald Waddell of the O.P.P. waited in the post office.

MARKHAM — Disposal service contractor, Ralph Spademan, told Markham Town Council Monday, that although the average volume of garbage collected from homes has increased from 30 to 120 pounds per family per pickup in the last 14 years, he has tried to maintain the lowest possible price. The fee in 1954 was 25c a week. It is now 43c.

STOUFFVILLE — It was announced at the annual meeting of the Stouffville District Credit Union, September 29, that liquid assets have increased by \$253,000 over the past year. Loans to members increased by \$151,000. The total assets in the credit union increased to \$1,498,000.

During the year, members deposits and term deposits increased by \$295,000, and shares and savings increased by \$130,000. Deposits now total \$860,000, and shares held total \$566,700. Dividends to shareholders will be paid at the rate of 5 1/2% and are life insured at no extra charge.

Reach GO-train objective

YORK CTY. — Ticket sales on the C.N.R. GO-train, to run from Barrie to Toronto and return, Oct. 16, have exceeded the original objective, reports the project sponsor, John Medcof of Mount Albert. Cash receipts now total \$1,633.05. Mr. Medcof has indicated that 200 additional passengers can still be accommodated and extra coaches will be added if necessary.

MARKHAM — When the Markham District High School Board was in operation, it was felt by the members that the west of the school was a serious problem, and a study was undertaken to see if it could be corrected. When control was taken over by the new board this year, it was decided the cost would be paid by the town.

Drug fines - \$450

UNIONVILLE — Two Toronto boys were fined a total of \$450 on two drug charges, by Judge R. Graham, in Richmond Hill Court, Oct. 3. Howard Snobel was assessed \$150 or 10 days for possession of narcotics. The maximum penalty for the offence is 7 years. Richard Lent was fined \$300 plus 7 days in jail for possession of drugs for the purpose of trafficking. When arrested, Lent had \$700 worth of hashish, worth from \$1500 to \$2,000 on the open market, according to the federal prosecutor. The charge carries a maximum penalty of life imprisonment.

In registering the conviction, Judge Graham commented that perhaps he was erring on the side of leniency, but on the basis of good pre-sentence reports, he felt if there was any chance that the boys could be taught a lesson by their experience the court should take that chance.

The two were arrested earlier this year in a Unionville shopping plaza, and later turned over to the RCMP by the Markham Twp. Police.

All of us have had substantial increases in our assessment. The county assessment department has tried to establish a fair and equitable basis for the assessing of your property and have used the Ontario Provincial Manual of Assessing as a guide.

Increased assessments does not necessarily mean increased taxes. The municipalities of York County will require approximately the same amount of money to operate in 1970 as they have in 1969.

Taxes are arrived at by multiplying the assessment by the mill rate. An increased assessment will mean a decreased mill rate in all our municipalities in York County.
