"If more than a million dollars of public money is available to alleviate the truck traffic conditions in Claremont, it seems to me the money would be much better spent to install water and sewer services in the village, after switching the gravel traffic to rail. Water and sewer services would enable the village to grow and prosper. Shops could be concentrated in a new offstreet shopping centre. Claremont would have a new lease on life. Normal traffic increase can be handled for some years yet by repairing the Brock Road through the village

at modest cost." "Ironically, a good percentage of the \$11/4 million the new road will cost will be spent to buy gravel with the taxpayers' money from the very gravel companies who will make most use of the new road. When things like this hap-
