STOUFFVILLE — The pros and cons of Stouffville's Main Street 'courtesy walks' came up for discussion, Dec. 11, at a meeting of Planning Board.

Member Reg. MacKay said he had made special observations of the conduct of both cars and pedestrians and concluded that there was no reason to change.

Chairman Bill Kamps recommended that an orange pylon, similar to those used by the Dept. of Highways, be erected as a

warning to motorists. On the subject of street-widening, Mr. MacKay urged that something be done to alleviate the parking problem on Park Drive North. He noted that the outlet onto Main was so narrow that at times, when cars are parked both east and west of the corner, it is difficult to get through.

At the intersection of Main Street East and Cemetery Lane, the Board agreed that one house, blocking a more direct entrance, should be removed.

Receive attendance awards


