On the subject of streetwidening, Mr. MacKay urged that something be done to alleviate the parking problem on Park Drive North. He noted that the outlet onto Main was so narrow that at times, when cars are parked both east and west of the corner, it is difficult to get through.

At the intersection of Main Street East and Cemetery Lane, the Board agreed that one house, blocking a more direct entrance, should be removed.


