'Time off' for teachers against board policy

YORK CTY. — An Aurora school teacher ran into a snag when she asked York County Board of Education for one week leave of absence, with policy proving to be the stumbling block.

Mrs. Margaret Fry told the board her husband had a business trip to make, and plans made last September called for her to accompany him. She said they would not be able to return until Jan. 9 which meant she could not be available for teaching duties until Monday, Jan.

12. Mrs. Fry pointed out that she had 12 years service as a teacher in Aurora and that under the former regime there was never any problem when a situation like the present one concerned a teacher.

John Honsberger, Thornhill, said the board could not get involved where teachers desired time off. "We have spent the year making policies and now we are asked to make exceptions." He expressed the opinion that no leave of absence be granted.
