

# Build new \$452,000 St. Patrick's Church

MARKHAM — Construction has started on the new St. Patrick's Roman Catholic Church on Highway 7 West in Markham. The cost of the project is \$451,589.72. It is expected that the building will be completed this summer.

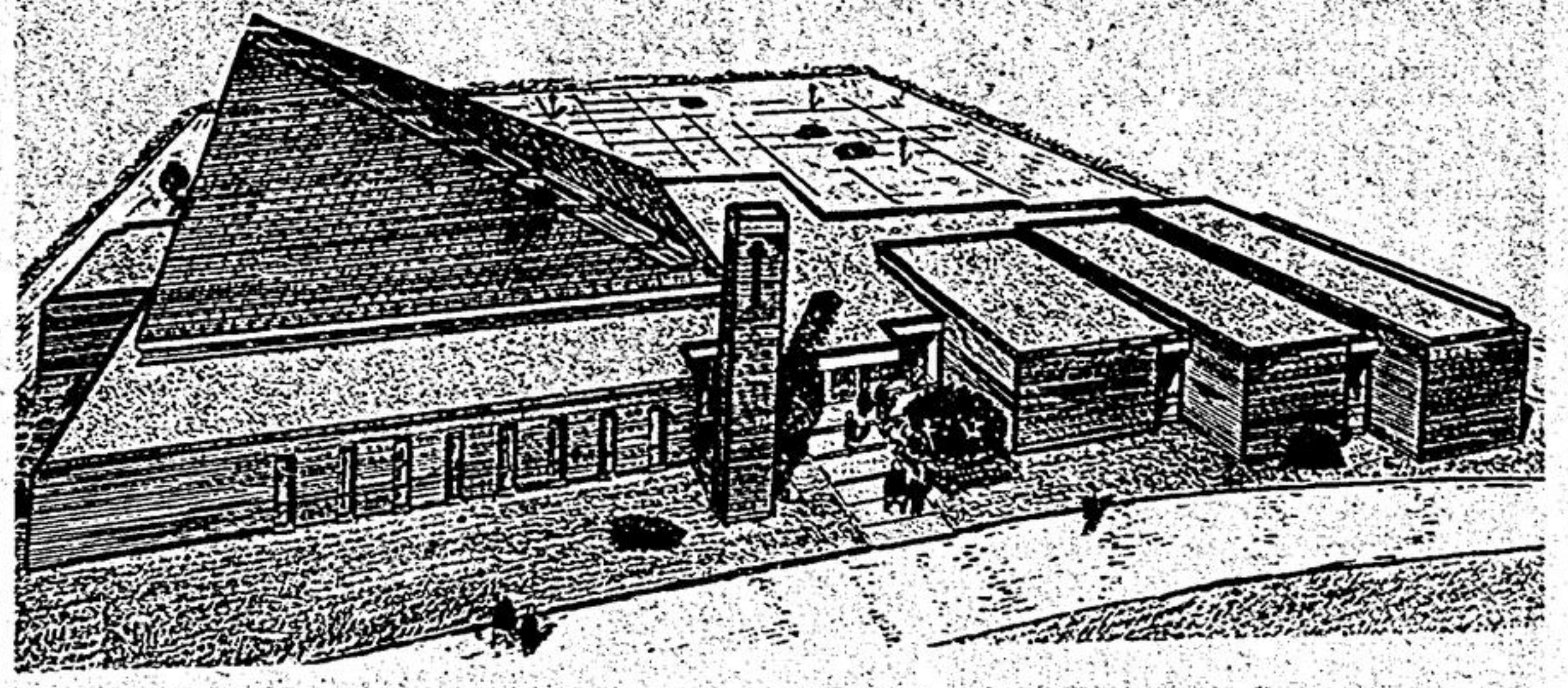
The building committee, consisting of 23 members, two of whom are teenagers, is headed by Mr. W. J. Blaney, O.C., Markham, R.R. 2.

Over \$200,000 of the cost will come from a fund of accumulated donations dating back over the past 100 years. The balance will be borrowed and repaid through the intended donations of the parishioners.

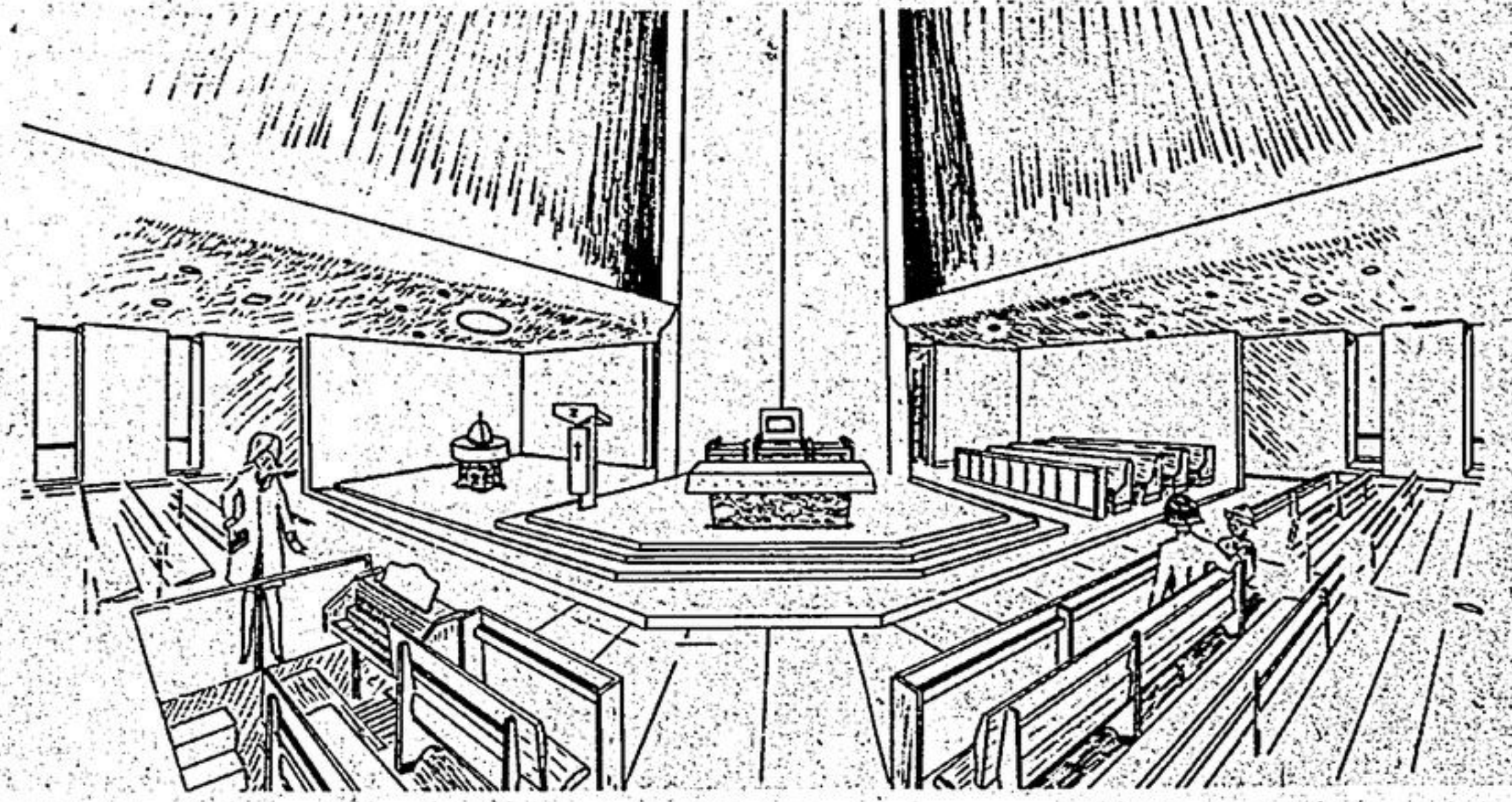
The history of the parish dates back to 1857, when the first church was built. A second building was erected in 1864 at a cost of \$600.00. The present church, which accommodates 176, was built in 1870. All of the timbers in the building were hewn from trees cut on adjoining properties.

The new building, which is on the property adjoining St. Patrick's School, will accommodate 854. A large Parish Hall with smaller meeting rooms and a modern kitchen will adjoin the church.

St. Patrick's has a membership of over 750 families (more than 4,000 people) from an area bounded by Steeles Avenue, the Markham-Pickering townline, the Aurora Sideroad and Don Mills Road. Masses are also conducted during the summer at St. William's, a mission church at Musselmanns Lake, and throughout the year in St. Mark's School, Stouffville.

## From the minister's study

Another decade has dawned on our fair land and its people. I wonder what is in store. After looking over the events of the 60's did you project yourself ahead another 10 years to 1980? It's frightening when you consider everything!

J. Edgar Hoover wrote a most illuminating article in a biweekly magazine, Christianity Today. As you probably know, Mr. Hoover is the director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, has been since 1924. His perspective on life is quite different from ours. He sees the raw side too. What he says in that article is probably the most sensible statement for our nation, our schools and our homes in this new decade. "Whether we like it or not," he says, "the morals to which we subscribe as a people are vital to our survival as a free nation".

But we don't like to talk of morals, Mr. Hoover. We want to make up the rules as we go along, as they fit the situation. Don't tell us about duty and honour and virtue. We have outgrown such cumbersome antiquities. I wonder!

The director of the F.B.I. goes much further than the mere mention of morals. If that irks some people think what this will do: "Fear of God and faith in God as the keys to American freedom were freely acknowledged by Americans and observed by visitors. The first American president voiced this in the simple words: 'It is impossible to govern the world without God'. The keen perception of J. Edgar Hoover opens before us the secret of American success as a nation in the past. Government was Godly, and therefore good; citizens were faithful, and therefore free."

In That article Mr. Hoover faces the grim realities of the present. He says: "We are witnessing an era of permissiveness in which vacillating pedagogues and parents too often abdicate their decision-making roles, thus forcing their responsibilities to fall on immature students and children... we are witnessing a denial of formally accepted values..."

O.K. let's look ahead into the decade of the 70's. But before we do, we would do well to look into the deep recesses of our own individual lives, and decide here and now where we are going, and how we are travelling to our destination. "We have to decide what kind of world we want — one of liberty or one of license."
