More weddings in the offing. Bob Wilkins and his fiance plan to be married in May. And Roy Robinson and Debbie Holman became engaged over the holidays.

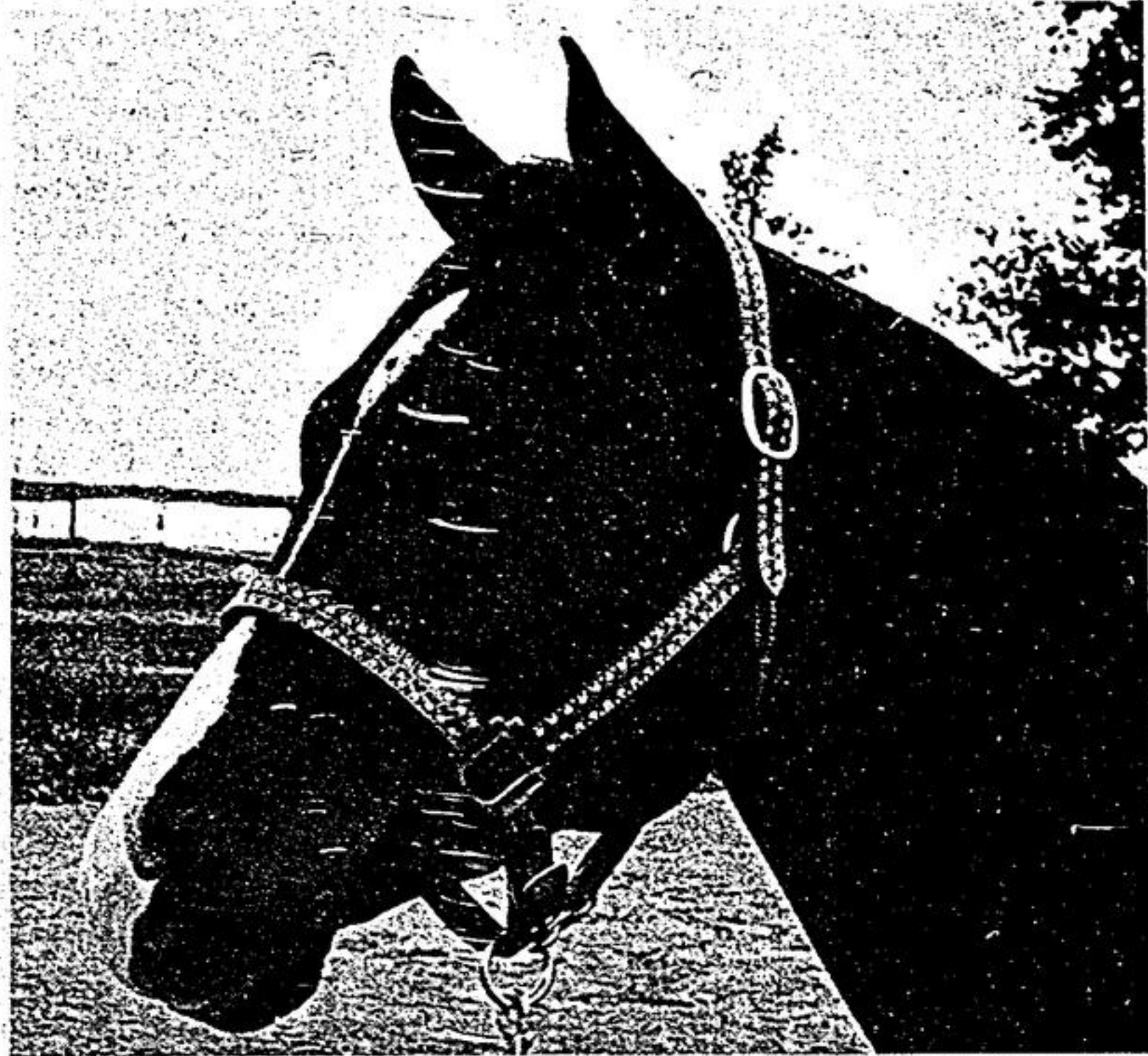
Friday is euchre series night at Buttonville W.I. Hall. At the first game, Jan. 3, there were twenty-four tables of players.
