# New home for Whitchurch parents and 11 children

**WHITCHURCH** — The family of Mr. and Mrs. Peter Dupont, burned out of their Conc. 6 home a month ago, have a new start on life, thanks to the generosity of friends, neighbors and people from all over the province who came to their aid after reading about or hearing of their plight through the news media.

The Duponts, who lost nearly all their possessions

in the blaze, received articles of clothing, furniture, appliances, food, and money. Many of the goods they could not use were given to church and charitable groups for redistribution to needy families.

The family, now residing in the former Lemonville Public School, are renovating a farm house on the Bloomington Road which they have rented from a Toronto firm at a reasonable cost.

Mr. Dupont and his children have been working long hours in the eleven room building which had received minor damage from a fire and more extensive damage through the work of vandals.

He told The Tribune that nearly every pane of glass had to be replaced, as well as most of the electrical fixtures.

They offer their profound thanks to all who have helped them get re-established.
