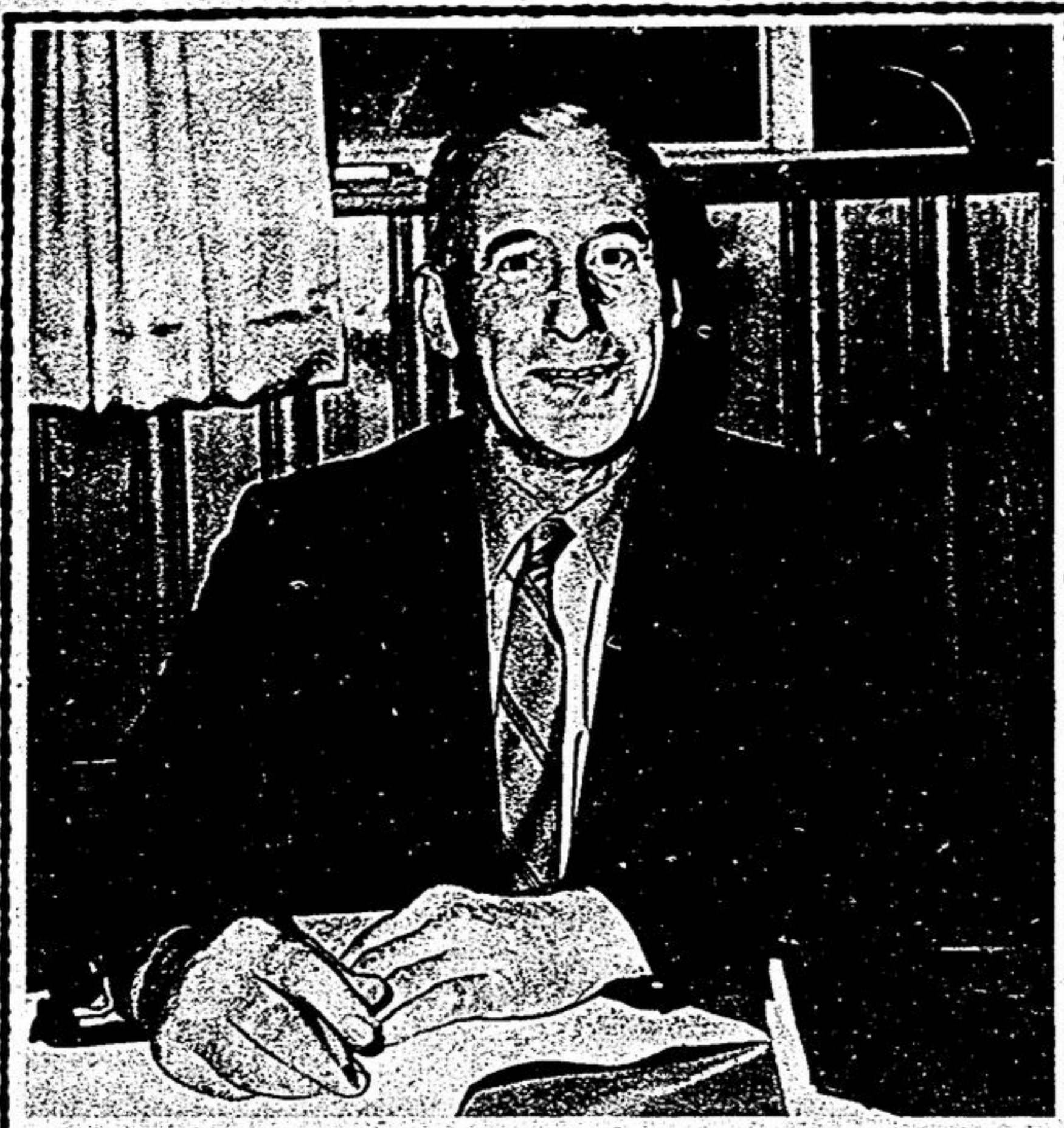


Goodwood goaltender earns award
