BALSAM—MT. ZION — The Men's Club are holding a Family Night, Monday evening, Feb. 9. The program will be in the form of a crokinole party.

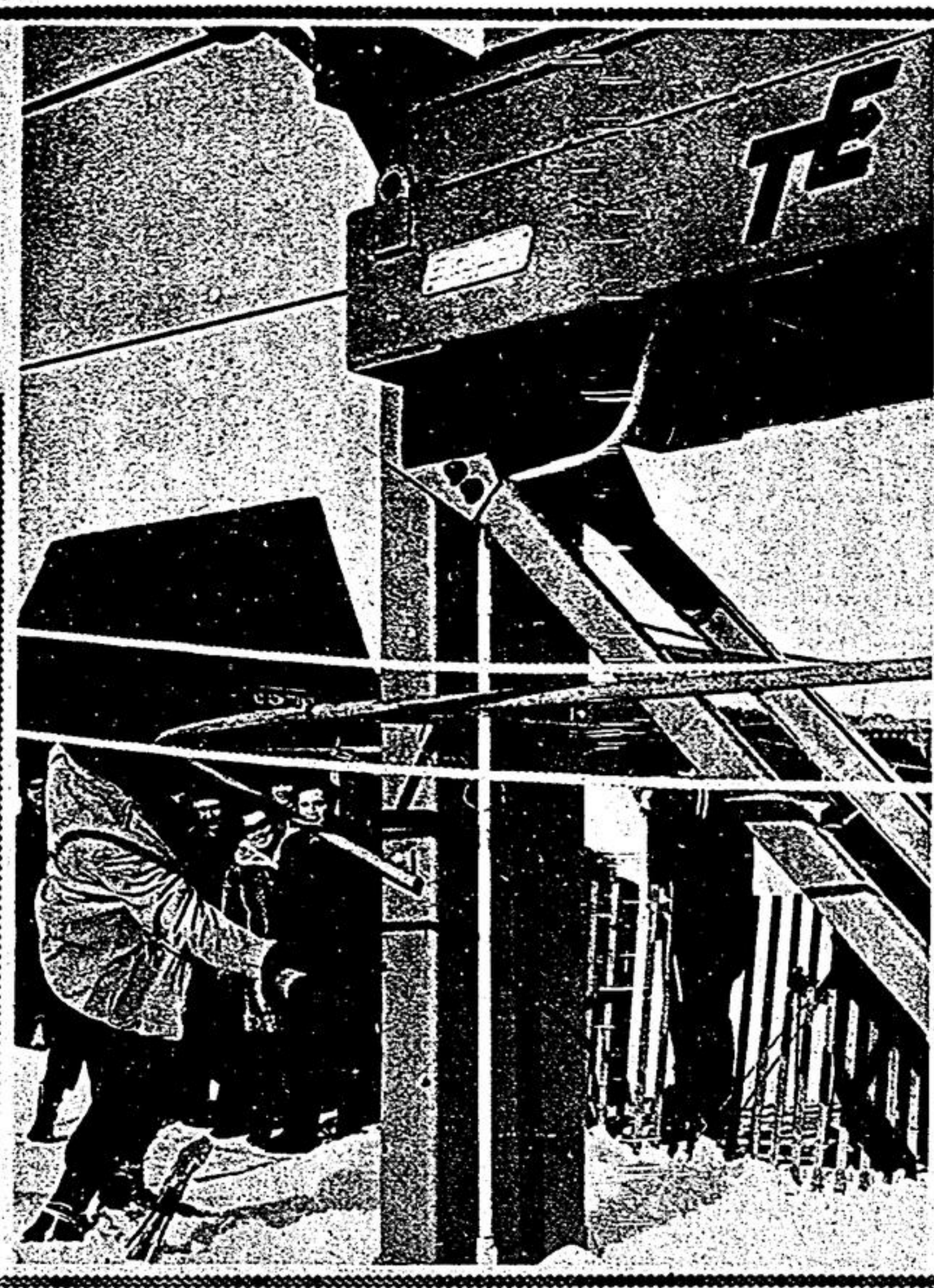
Mrs. Frank Disney has been admitted to Fairview Lodge.
