Squabble over car brings family to court

MARKHAM—A squabble over a set of car keys that began in a home on Sherwood Forest Drive and continued on the driveway outside, had its conclusion in Richmond Hill Court, Friday.

David Manning, 20, charged his stepfather Gilbert Beaulieu, 43 with assault.

The case was dismissed by Judge Russell G. Pearse.

Manning, in his testimony, said he intervened when he saw his stepfather push his mother during an argument. In the fight that ensued, the two mov-

ed outside because, according to the complainant, 'we were making a mess of the house'.

During the scuffle, Manning said he fell to the pavement and fractured his skull. He was confined to hospital over one weekend, he told the court.

Mr. Beaulieu testified that he and his wife had been separated for almost a month. He said he was finding it difficult to keep payments up on the car, a truck and the house. He said he had intended to sell the automobile.

The accused admitted phoning his wife first before visiting the residence.

The solicitor for Mr. Beaulieu noted that his client was not the aggressor in the skirmish but had only tried to defend himself. He observed that the complainant outweighed the accused by twenty pounds.

Judge Pearse, in handing down his decision, noted that Mr. Beaulieu shared the ownership of the house and the car. He pointed out too, that he had notified his wife in advance of his intention to call. "I'm dismissing this whole matter," he concluded.

How To Avoid A Big Accident



Get in the habit of avoiding small ones.

This advice from fleet safety supervisors comes from the fact that the average person finds it difficult to think of himself as a candidate for a serious accident. So he lets a traffic safety message go in one ear and out the other. It was meant for some other fellow.

Well, dented fenders and scratches that happen to everyone as a result of driving faults are really just practice sessions for a major accident waiting to happen.

The trainers of professional drivers instruct their students in three basic rules: 1—Keep your eyes moving; 2—Get the big picture; 3—Make sure they see you. Out of 100 drivers in tests over the last 10 years, 97 left themselves wide open to an accident in their everyday driving by neglecting one or more of these rules.

Avoid staring at the car ahead and keep your eyes moving with quick glances at the wheels of the cars around you and your rear view mirror.

Get the "big picture" by looking far ahead and back! You will have time for a lane change to avoid delay at traffic lights but avoid turning into the path of a car behind you.

If you make an error but luckily avoid an accident, learn from it.
