Appointment illegal

UXBRIDGE TWP. — Reeve Robert Nesbitt's appointment as Uxbridge Township's representative on the Metro Toronto and Region Conservation Authority has been ruled illegal. The reason? Because reeve Nesbitt voted for himself.

Deputy reeve Earl Dowswell recalled that he was in the chair at the time and the vote on the resolution was 3-2. However, no one could remember if councillor George

Harvie had voted at all on the issue. Mr. Dowswell admitted that no recorded vote had been asked for.

The deputy reeve pointed out that, according to the Municipal Act, it was not lawful for the appointee to vote on his own appointment. It was moved by councillor Clark Muirhead and seconded by Mr. Dowswell that the resolution of Jan. 12 be rescinded.

No immediate action to fill the vacancy followed.
