Pollution probe panel

UXBRIDGE - A public meeting under the heading of 'Pollution Probe', will be held, Feb. 24 at 7:30 p.m. in the auditorium of the Uxbridge High School.

Problems to be discussed include the disposal of liquid waste in the Brenner dump north of Stouffville and the possible utilization of pit sites in Uxbridge Township for the same purpose.

Guest speakers are, conservationist, Ronald D. Lawrence of Ajax; Whitchurch councillor Merlyn Baker and pollution experts from the University of Toronto.

The public is invited. In 1969, Metro Toronto disposed of 1,500,000 tons of garbage. In 15 years, this figure is expected to increase to almost four million.

Each year, 20 million gallons of liquid industrial

waste comes out of Metro. A large portion of this is trucked to the Brenner dump in Whitchurch.
