

Markham police work increased 25%

MARKHAM - Calls for police service have increased by 25 per cent in the Town of Markham over the past year. This information was revealed by Police Chief Fred White, in his annual report to municipal council, March 2.

The increase, Chief White said, is consistent with growth in the town, and supports the request for the full time operation of the department, both in the office and on patrol. Domestic complaints, according to the report, have doubled in number, reaching 69 over the year. The chief commented that much time is involved in listening to these problems and settling them, if possible. If the situation is serious, the matters are processed in the Family Court at Newmarket, and the Department becomes involved in probation assistance.

One hundred and fifty five juvenile complaints were investigated, and where the department could not solve the problem, they were referred to Juvenile Court. Most of these complaints came during the summer months, when the children were out of school. There was only one act of serious damage by juveniles during the year, which is considered good for a town the size of Markham. The number of complaints has not shown a marked increase over the year.

Night protection for industrial, commercial and business premises has increased, with over 200 locations checked nightly. This is now a full shift for one car. For safety's sake, the chief said, there should be two officers in the car in case of trouble.

Ten sudden deaths were investigated by the Department. Twenty-eight were injured in accidents, mostly traffic, and three in an industrial accident.

There were two armed robberies, one at a bank, the other in a store. Neither involved violence. House break-ins remained about the same as in 1968. Thefts doubled, with the majority of them solved. Arrests showed a slight increase.

The most serious need of the Department, according to the chief, is to be able to provide a full-time operation so that services will be available to the citizens at a moment's notice.

Council members accepted Chief White's report and complimented him on the completeness of its information.

Form anti-pollution body

UXBRIDGE - Ninety-two concerned citizens attended an anti-pollution meeting, Feb. 24 at the Uxbridge Secondary School. Later, 70 of them agreed to join the Citizens Anti-Pollution Association.

From the discussions held during and after the meeting, it was apparent most persons were concerned about regaining some kind of control over the environment in which they live, and that the most specific problems were the proliferation of gravel pits in the Uxbridge area and the use of the Bremner Dump near Stouffville for liquid industrial waste.

To combat this type land use, one of the speakers, Uxbridge Township councillor Clark Muirhead, pointed out that the first objective was to fight the proposed legislation of Ontario Minister of Mines, Allan Lawrence.

Merlyn Baker, Whit-church Township councillor, pointed to political problems and public apathy that inhibited control of the Bremner dump.
