Deputy-reeve Barnard

Waste - don't blame us

WHITCHURCH TWP. — Deputy-reeve Norman Barnard has defended action taken by Whitchurch Township Council in an effort to control the dumping of liquid industrial waste in the municipality.

His comment, April 6, followed a warning by councillor Merlyn Baker that no garbage agreement be signed with York Sanitation Company without assurance that liquid refuse would not be included.

Mr. Barnard said the matter of waste control had occupied much of council's time since all members were concerned over the possibility of pollution. He said he hoped the press would take note of the fact.

Councillor Gordon Ratcliff said that what council had done or had attempted to do, was of no consequence. He said he wanted to know what jurisdiction the township actually had over such matters.

In two resolutions, one moved by councillor Ratcliff and a second by councillor Merlyn Baker, it was agreed that further tests should be made of soil samples in the area of the Bremner property to learn the exact depth of liquid waste penetration. Seek solution to drug problem

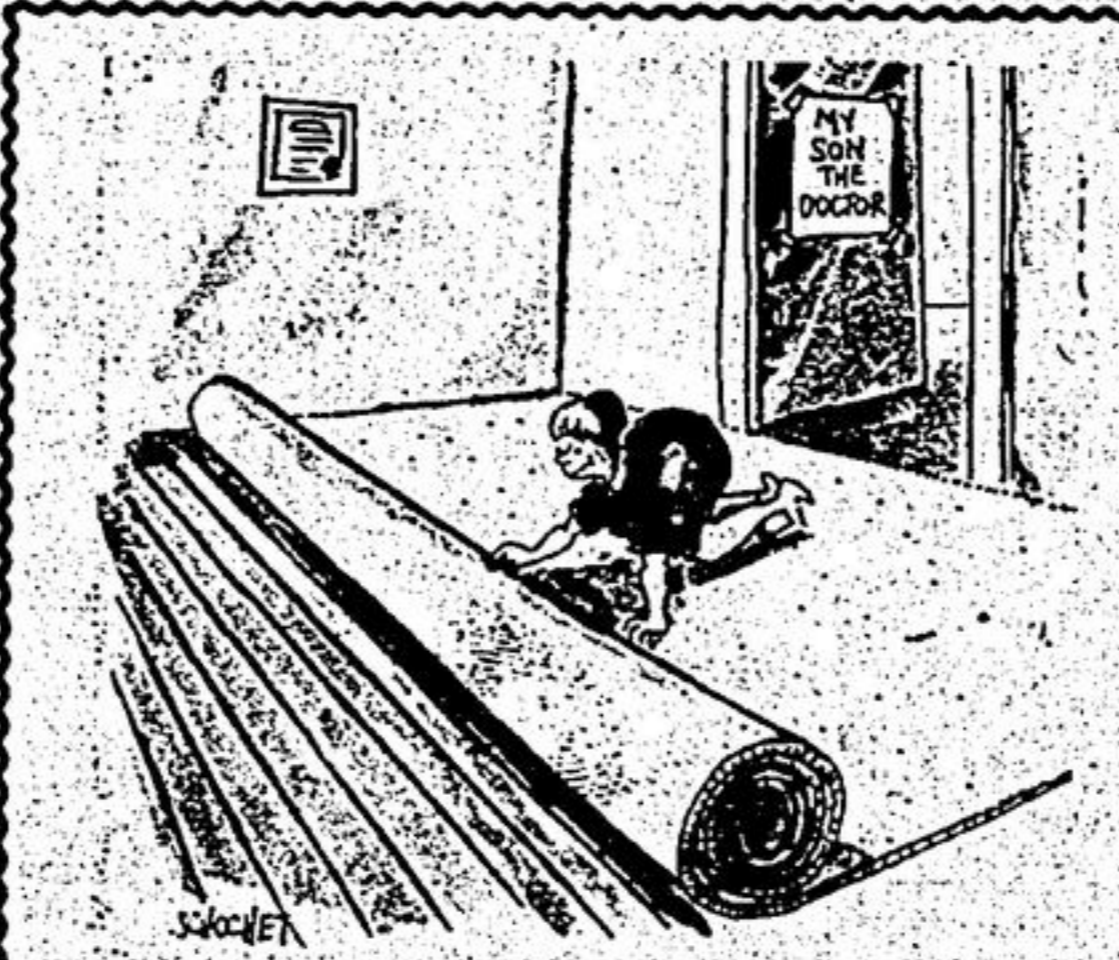
YORK CTY. — Marijuana use among students, once the concern of York Cty. Board of Education, has been replaced by a much more serious problem — ephedrine (speed) and heroin.

Dr. John Denison of Mount Albert told a Board meeting, Monday that there were at least 400 'hard' drug users in area schools with the ingredients available on short notice.

Dr. Denison outlined plans to meet with civic officials, students, teachers, police, local doctors and the press to set up 'social action committees' to discuss the problem and formulate solutions.

With Board approval, he recommended that schools in key areas be utilized during the summer months as 'drop-in centres' whereby young people could organize, activities, form 'job banks', and enroll in drug education courses.

Dr. Denison said that drug use, most prevalent at the secondary school level, was also known to exist in some public schools.
