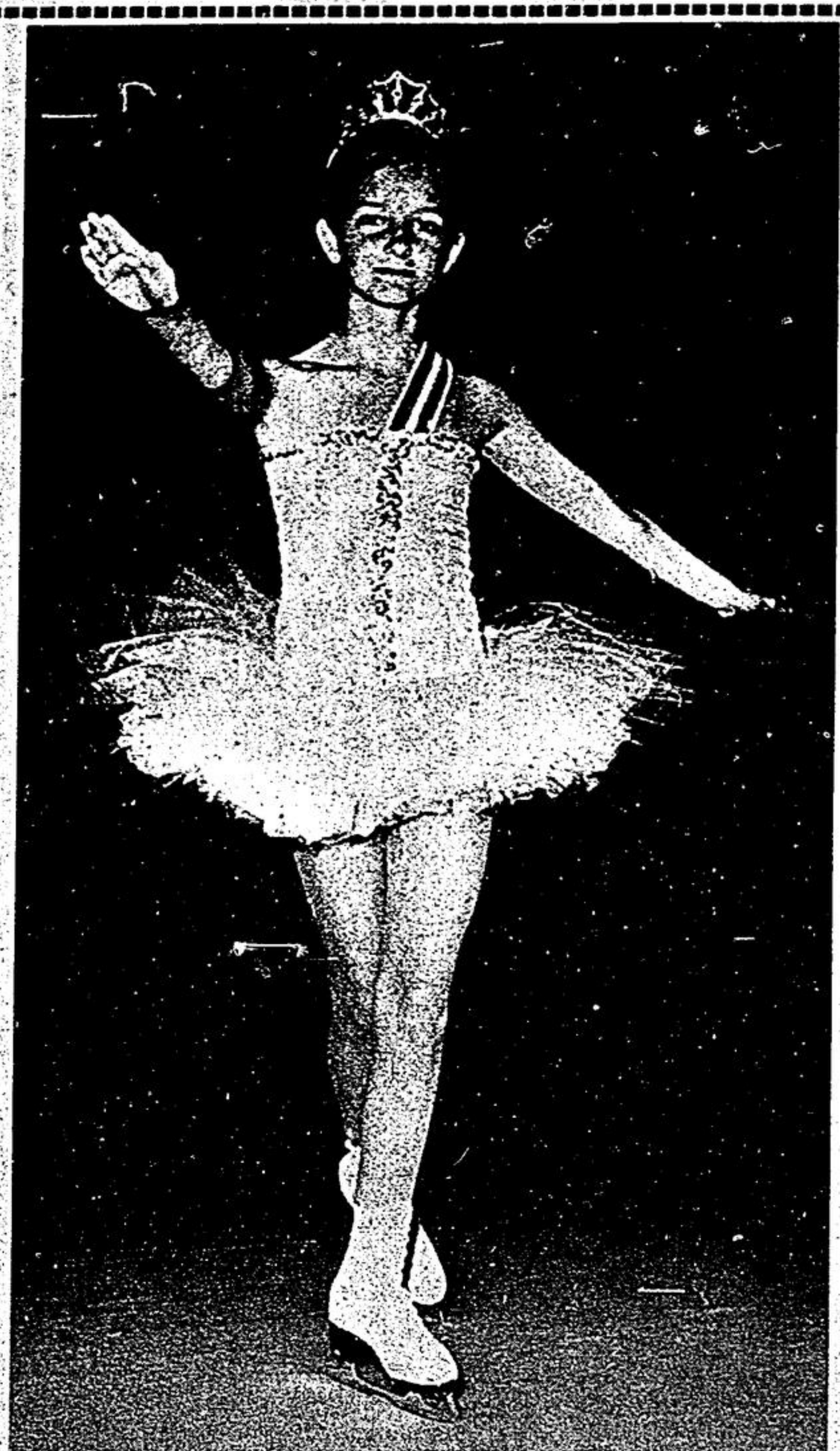


Girl Guides

Discussion groups

STOUFFVILLE — An interesting program has been started recently in Stouffville by a group of young women seeking stimulation outside their homes. It is sponsored by the Family Life Centre in Markham and was formulated for the purpose of providing speakers, films, a forum for the exchange of ideas and a chance to make new social contacts.
 The group meets once a week at the Anglican Church where a nursery school has been set up by qualified volunteers. The purpose is to provide the children and their mothers with new learning experiences.
 The pilot program

consisted of a series of 5 speakers, each followed by a discussion. The speakers included Mario Bartoletti of the Family Life Centre, Mary Smith of Stouffville, Newmarket Hospital, a children's librarian, Betty Brite of Consumers Gas, and a speaker from the Institute of Child Study in Toronto. The first session met with such enthusiastic response, the group has commenced another 6-week program which will cover such topics as drugs, the teenager, and education.
