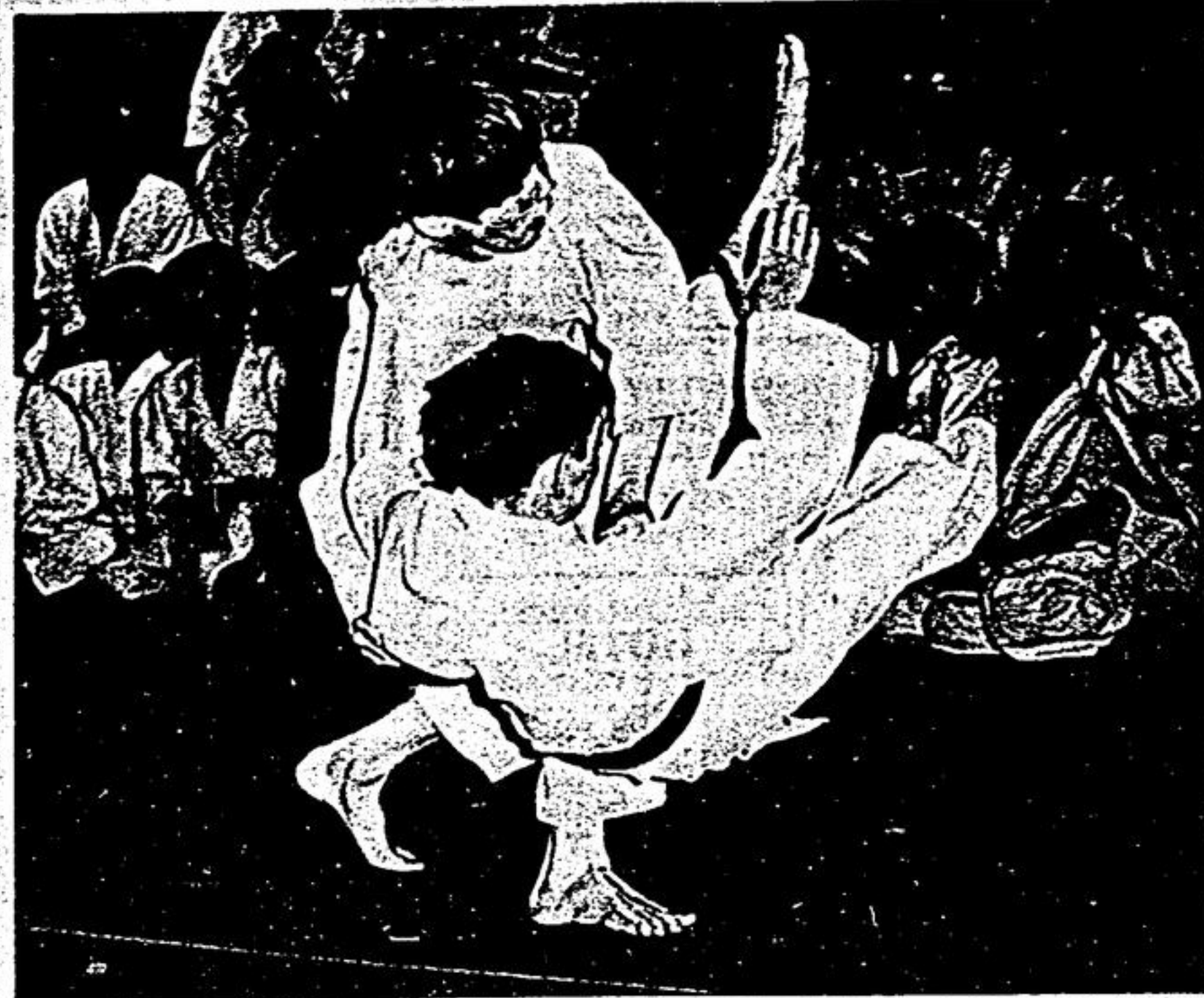
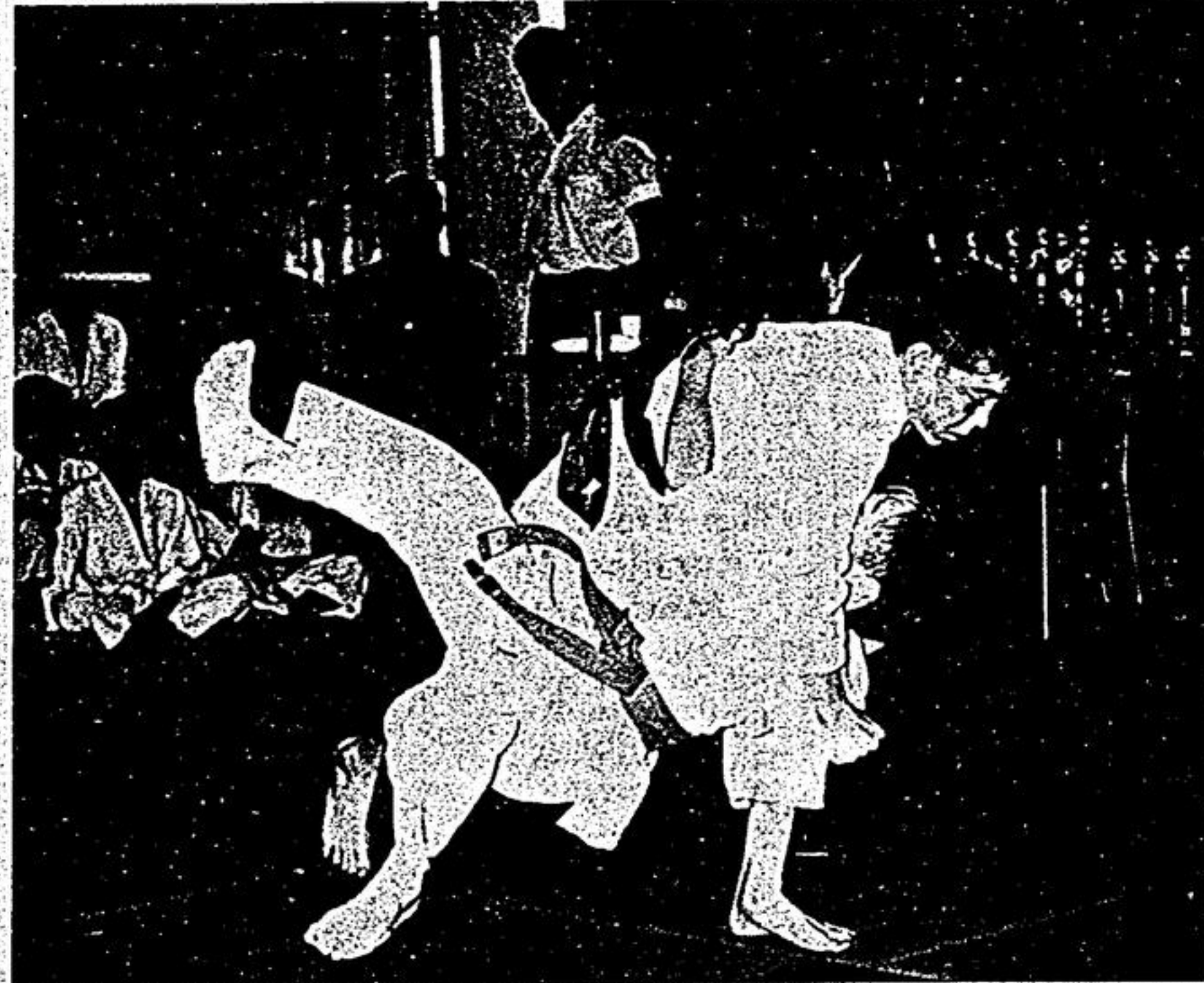

# Ho-tai judo club win many awards

WHITCHURCH TWP. — The Ho-Tai Judo Club held its Second Invitational Junior Tournament at the Whitchurch Centennial Centre on Sunday, April 26th. There were 70 competitors, all under 18 years old, from Ho-Tai, Metro Judo Club, Toronto, and Beverly Hills United Church Judo Club, Weston.

The Championship in the under 60 lb. division was decided in a tough overtime match, with Marek Kaczynski winning the first place trophy, donated by Chris and Scott Dinel, and Brian Wong taking the runner-up, donated by Mr. and Mrs. T. Harrison. Both these contestants from Ho-Tai Club were awarded their green belts for their excellent effort.

In the 60-80 lb. division, the Championship was won by Roy Degeer (Ho-Tai), who defeated four opponents, all by excellent throwing technique. The trophy, from Herb Peach, was won by Martin Baron (Metro). Jack Gianone, a white belt holder from the Beverly Hills Club was awarded that Club's Best Competitor plaque for his excellent performance in reaching the semi-finals in this division. One of the most exciting matches of the day took place in the 80-100 lbs. division, with Lynn Madill (Ho-Tai) winning over runner-up Tom McIlravey (Metro). The Championship trophy was donated by Mr. and Mrs. D. McManingwell, and the runner-up trophy by Stouffville I.G.A.

Another exciting fight took place in the 100-200 lb. division, with the Championship trophy (Aida Cleaners) going to Wayne Nesbitt (Ho-Tai), and the runner-up trophy (Ron Wrightman and Co.) going to Howard Miley (Metro). Winner of the Heavyweight Championship, donated by Aiken's Pharmacy, was Geza Von Diergardt (Ho-Tai), and the runner-up trophy from Hudson's Floral Designs went to Ralph Smalley (Ho-Tai).

The Metro Judo Club's Sportsmanship Award was presented to Katherine Foley, and the Sportsmanship Award for the Ho-Tai Club, donated by the Students of St. Andrew's College, went to Lesley Ann Harrison. Susan Madill (Ho-Tai) won an award as the Best Female Competitor, presented by the W.C.C. Ladies Auxiliary.

All competitors were presented with crests by Instructor Frank Goodenough. Club Instructor Jim Wong announced several promotions, which will be posted at the Club.

Referees were Dieter Braun and Ron Cormack, with Max Fedori, John Bone and Dan Yu as Judges.

PICKERING Beverley Boys of Pickering captured the one-metre springboard and tower events in the Quebec Diving Championships held at suburban Pointe Claire.

The Oshawa Aquatic Club competitor won the springboard title with 335.52 points while teammate Nancy Robertson of Oshawa was

second with 323.58. Third place went to Shirley Shatto of Ottawa with 313.72.

Miss Boys took the tower competition with 324.60 points.

To be eligible, boys must be under 12 years at December 31, 1970 for the Novice team. They must be less than 14 for Pee-wee eligibility, under 15 for Bantam status and less than 17 to qualify for the Midget squad.

A coach and manager are still needed for the Bantam team as well as umpires and other helpers.
