Basic herd-good business

YORK CTY. — Income tax isn't a very good topic

at any time, but one or two points could be made about it now while it is fresh. One is on basic herds. Somebody must be going around spreading the word that setting up a basic herd isn't any good now, with the White Paper tax reforms.

This story is nonsense. Basic herd still gives a farmer the chance to get his herd into the capital category, where it ought to be, along with machinery and buildings.

Capital gains and natural increases in livestock have always been taxable, basic herd or not; so if the reforms do become law, it won't make any difference to taxes on livestock.

Basic herd is offered to farmers to permit a fair application of income tax on livestock farms. Anyone who doesn't use it, is missing out. Basic herds can be set up by applying on a form obtained from the District Taxation Office, 37 Adelaide Street East, Toronto.

With DDT not available, farmers and home gardeners too, will have to choose another insecticide, or live with heavy insect damage.

Farmers will rely more on seed treatments using lindane and diazinon in small quantities. Sevin is a good quick killer for a wide range of insects, and good from a pollution point of view because it loses its toxicity in a day or two. Malathion and methoxychlor are quite useful too and give longer control.

Home gardeners will find malathion very useful. It works on almost any insect that is likely to be around, and gives control for about a week. Sevin will do the job quicker, but only lasts for a day or two, and used at blossom time is very toxic to bees. Methoxychlor is kinder to the bees and can be safely

used on ornamentals. Rotonone is still the best for leafy vegetables like lettuce and cabbage.

Outlook for May

Beef prices firm

With demand and consumer preference continuing strong, beef prices can be expected to be firm to higher, reports the Canada Department of Agriculture in its monthly Food Outlook. Prices for pork can be expected to show some seasonal strength. Broiler and roaster chicken will be in plentiful supply at lower prices.

Beef: With demand and consumer preference continuing strong, prices can be expected to be firm to higher.

Pork: Prices can be expected to show some seasonal strength.

Eggs: Plentiful supplies at lower prices.

Poultry Meat: Broiler and roaster chicken will be in plentiful supply at lower prices. Broiler turkey supplies will be plentiful, possibly with some slight easing of prices. Heavy turkey supplies will be adequate at firm prices.

Apples: Supplies heavier than usual. Little change in price from last month.

Potatoes: A seasonal rise in prices may be expected with storage and new imported potatoes in adequate supply.

Onions: Supplies of Canadian onions below normal — imports and prices will increase.

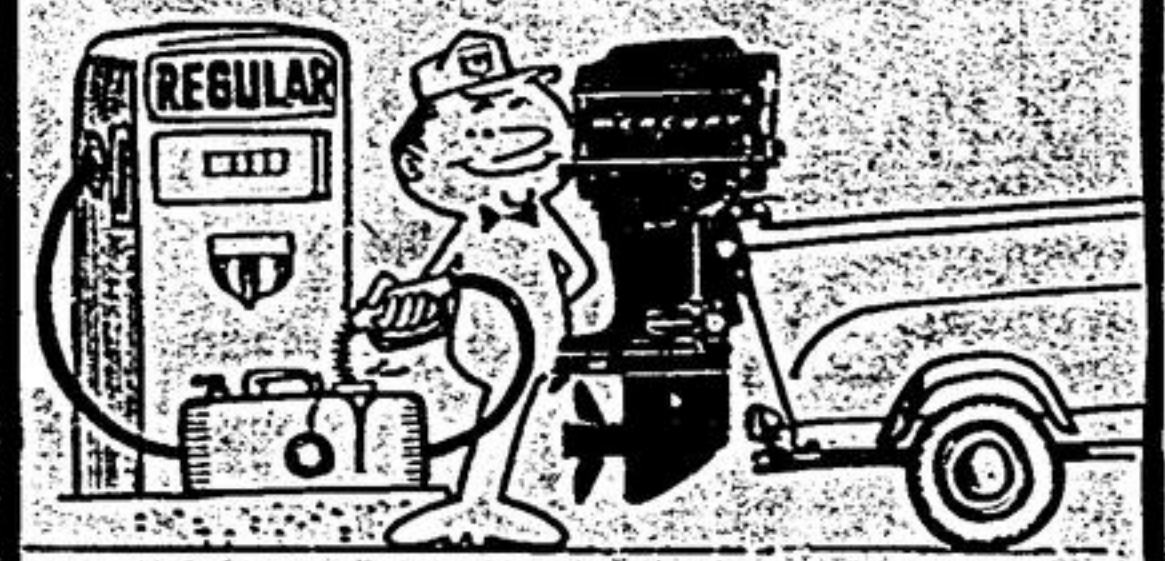
Carrots: Canadian storage supplies adequate, increasing supplies of new imported carrots with prices remaining steady.

Hothouse Cucumbers, Tomatoes: Increasing supplies will bring lower prices.
