From the minister's study

What is special about today, Thursday? Can't think of anything? The constant reminder, of course, is that this is Thor's Day. This is the day when we are supposed to remember the Norse god of war. Most of us do not pay much homage to that god any more, and in that case there isn't any need to suggest to Parliament that they change the name of the fifth day of the week. They have sufficient problems already to keep them busy for a long time. But what is so special about this Thursday, May 7th?

It's Ascension Day!
In all my years in Canada I have never seen a single sign in a store window reminding us of the Ascension of Jesus Christ. I have wondered why.

The Canadian population cannot live through December 25 without being aware of what day it is. They cannot escape Easter either, even if it changes with the moon. But Ascension Day, that escapes most people.

There are so many special days to fit into the modern, shrunken calendar. Mother's day, for example, falls on the weekend following Ascension Day. That leaves us with a major decision in our church services. Should we emphasize mothers or the Ascension of Jesus Christ? You will be interested, I am sure, to know where your church places its emphasis this Sunday.

Why do we need to think of the Ascension anyway? Look at the time and money we spend celebrating Christmas. We have numerous carols devoted to that lovely event. The crucifixion and resurrection, although they do not receive equal time with Christmas, are given quite a prominent place. Isn't that enough?

That, dear reader, is like going two-thirds of the way to Toronto. If the Ascension of Jesus Christ is minimized, the whole gospel falls to pieces. The resurrection proclaims victory over death, and brings Christ back into the world. The Ascension proclaims victory of all, and brings Christ back into heaven. If He isn't in heaven, you see, He must be somewhere on earth. That means you cannot pray to the Christian God. You don't know where He is.

The Ascension completes the picture. "So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, He was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God. And they went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them" (Luke 16:19f.).

Editor's mail

Dear Sir:
The recent meeting at the Stouffville High School on water pollution provided a small group of politicians with a rare opportunity to present themselves to an audience of at least a thousand persons.

It is not too often that politicians are able to appear before such a large assembly. I am not suggesting that all of the people on stage were using the issue of water pollution as a political expedient. I am suggesting, however, that some of them were.

The representatives of Whitechurch Council on stage have gone on record as stating that there would be a bylaw passed in the near future to close down the Bremner dump. It seems strange that a local Township Council has the power to stop an operation of this kind when our major Government has not.

The procrastination which has been shown by the Water Resources Commission and the Waste Management Commission is deplorable. It should be obvious to all that any dumping of liquid waste in this township is out and out pollution. It is not necessary to drill test holes to determine this. All a test hole does is show how far the pollution has gone.

Aside from ground and water pollution, there is also air pollution. Experts on that panel admitted that where there is odour from this liquid garbage it is simply gas escaping and contaminating the air we breathe. It is distressing to think that a person can be put out of business by the passing of a bylaw but in this case the danger to a large number of people is so great that we simply cannot not allow it to continue.

Consider this, if we can not stop this odious operation by legislation and if as seems probable, it is a financially profitable business, then every owner of small acreage in this township could, if he so desired, open up his property to these disposal companies; fill up every hole until he couldn't stand the stench himself, then sell out to these same companies and move away to some place that is too



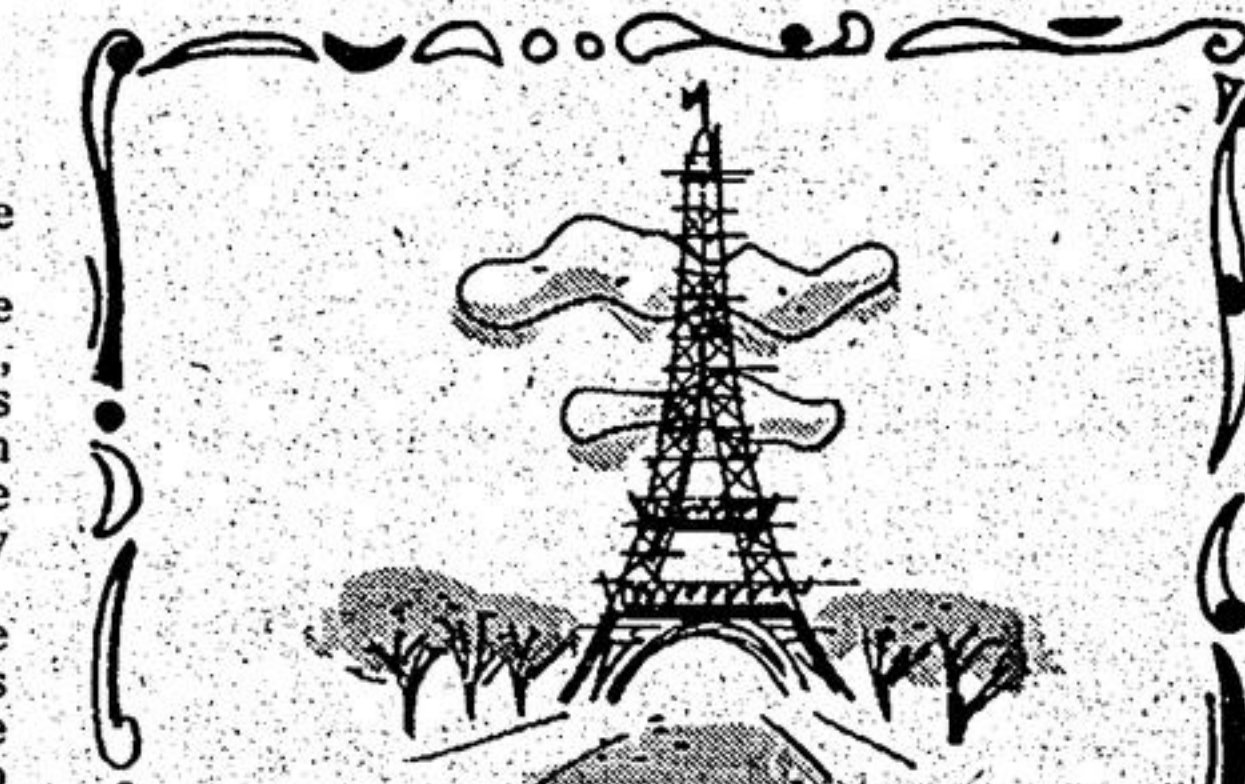
