Oshawa for the past few years to all schools in the county. The program will be optional and it will be the principal's responsibility to ensure every student has an opportunity to participate.

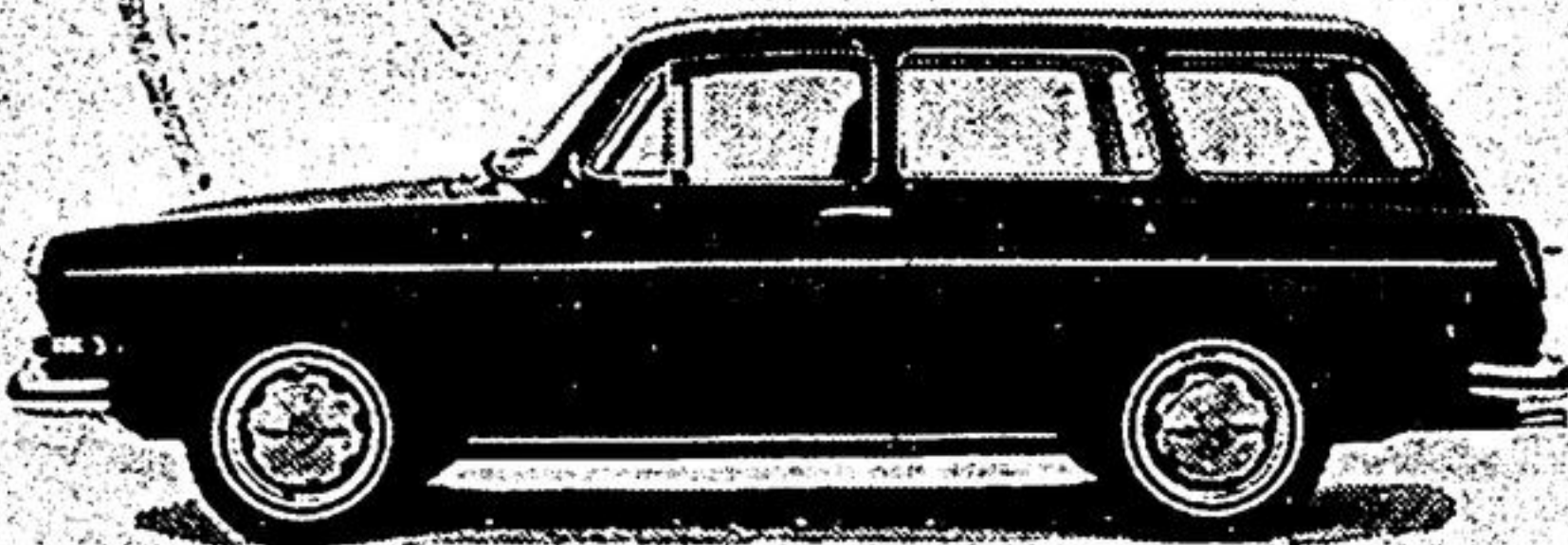
