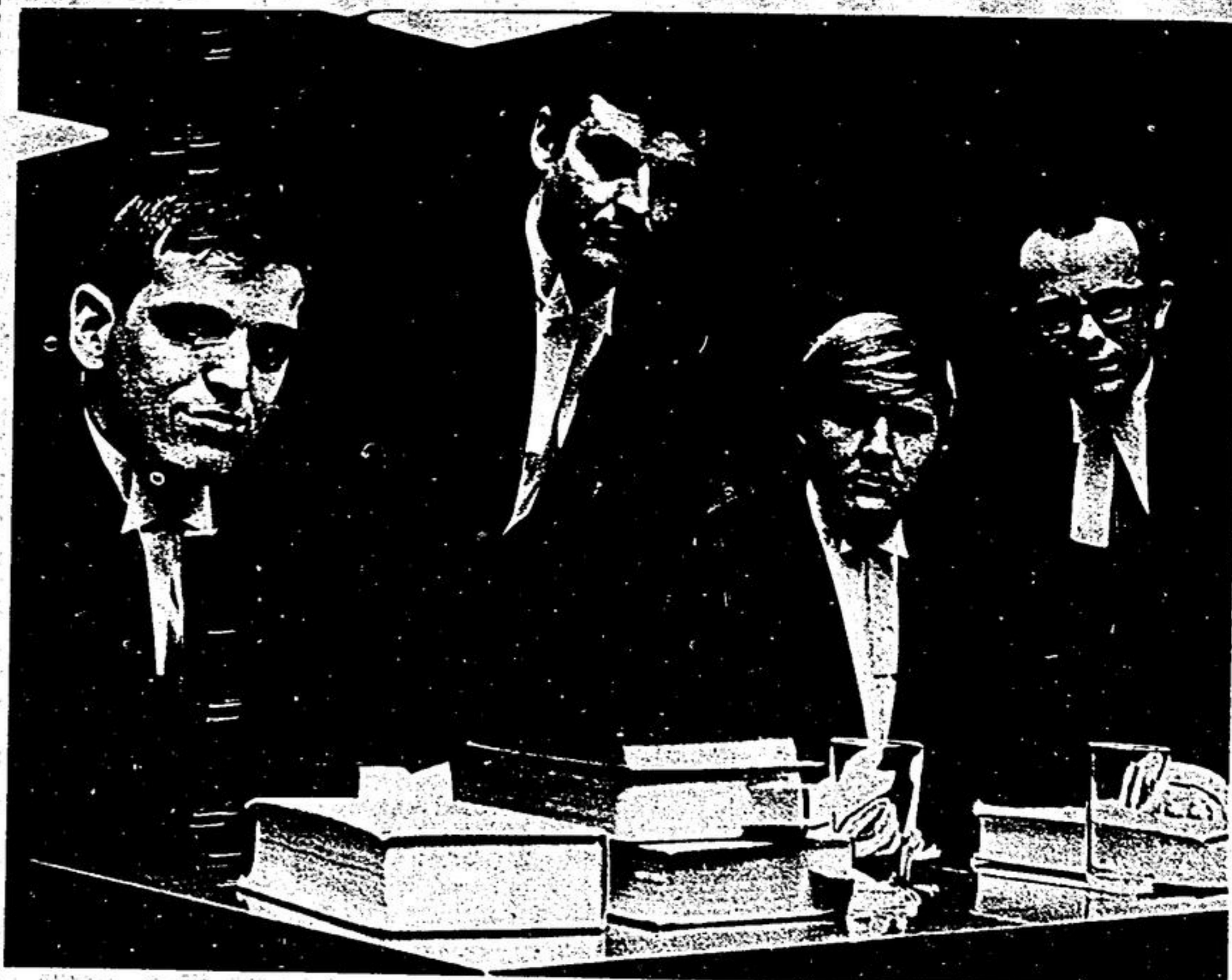

Mr. Andy Fletcher of the Dept. of Lands and Forests will address the Men's Club, May 11.

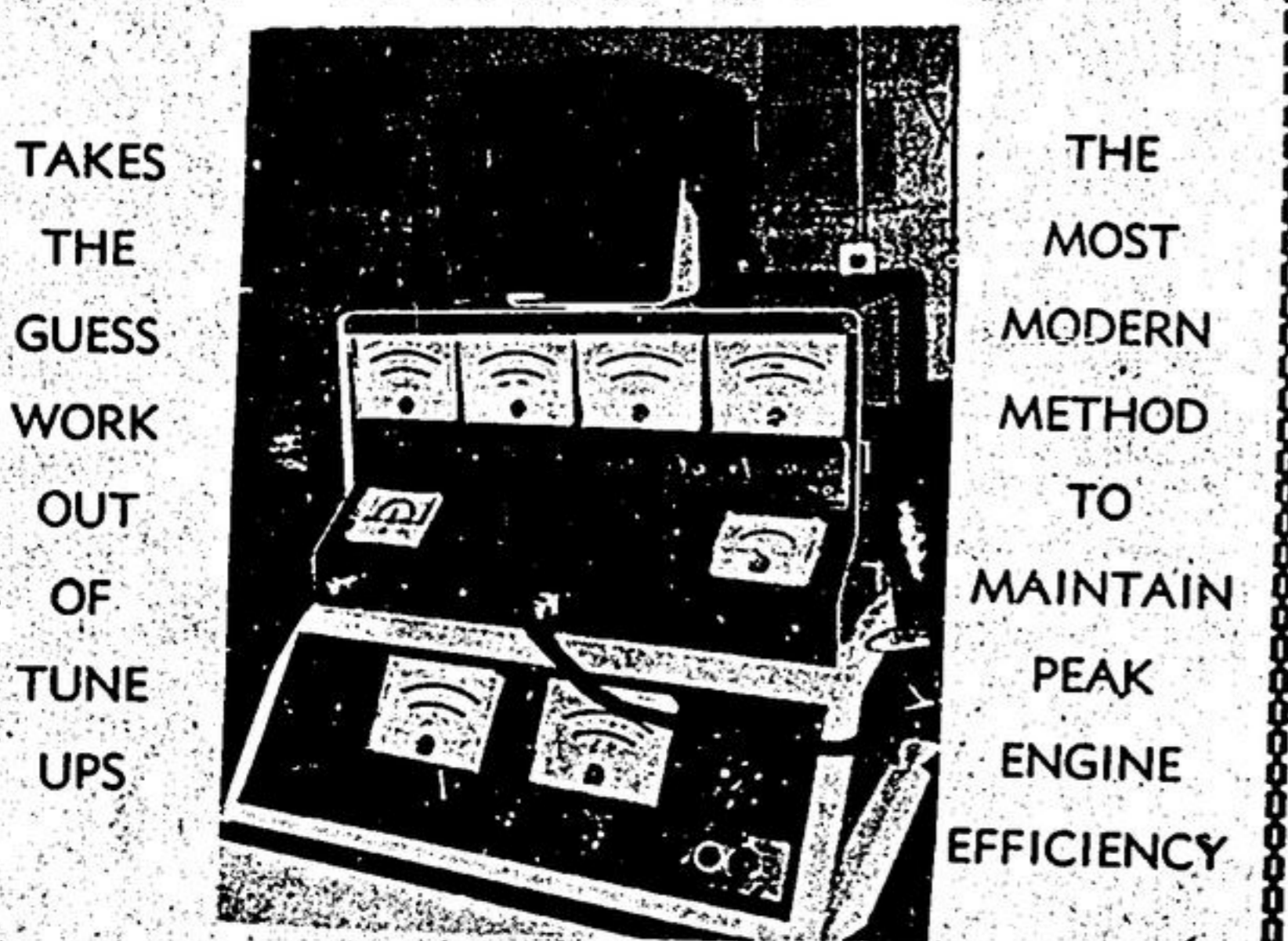
