Notice is hereby given to all persons in possession of land in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1960, C. 427, Sections 3, 13 and 19, that unless noxious weeds growing on their lands within the Township of Whitchurch are destroyed by the 15th day of June 1970, and throughout the season as often as it is necessary to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Municipality may enter upon the said lands and have the weeds destroyed, charging the costs against the owner and collecting in like manner as for municipal taxes. 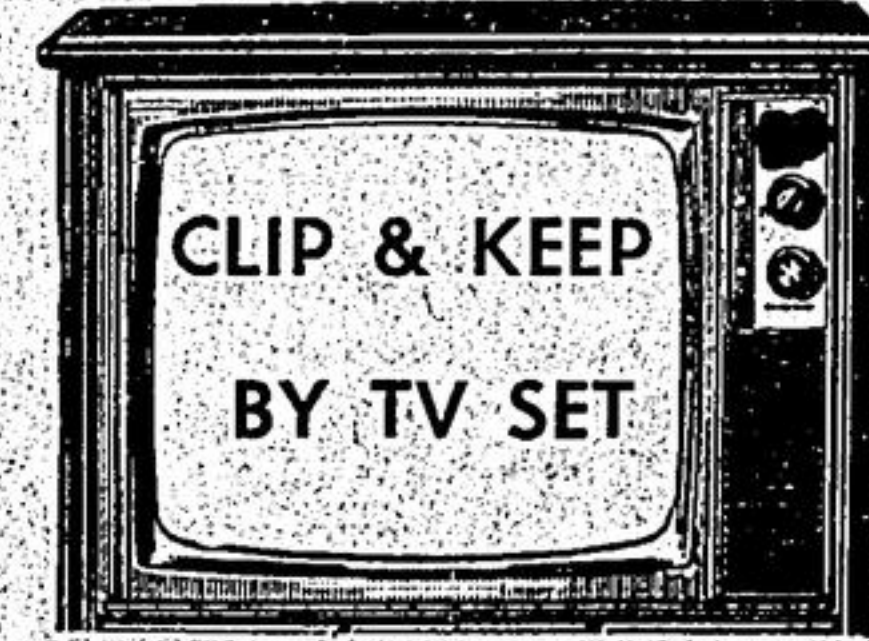
