Thirteen athletes advance to finals

STOUFFVILLE - The Stouffville District Secondary School boys track team placed second out of five schools competing in the Georgian Bay Zone meet, held in Port Perry, May 20.

Stouffville athletes defeated Uxbridge, Brock and Sutton, but lost out to Port Perry in total points.

Qualifying 13 competitors in 18 events, the team will advance to the Georgian Bay meet, being held Thursday (today) in Orillia.

Winning the Midget triple jump and hurdles, and placing second in the 220 won Geoff Aiken second place in the individual championship in his division. Geoff was awarded a medal for his efforts.

Keith Liedtke took firsts in the intermediate 400 and 800 metre events; Larry Spiece won the intermediate shot put with a mark of 49'5", and the intermediate discus; Blair Thompson won the Midget shot with a mark of 45'7".

All five Stouffville high jumpers qualified for the Georgian Bay meet: Midget, Paul Rodin; Intermediates, Duncan McDonald, Phil Kinton and Wayne Flynn; and senior, Allan Bacon.

Kim Greenfield won the Midget 400 and anchored sprint and mile relay teams. Other qualifiers included Jim Alty, who placed second in the Midget mile; Blaine Burnie, who placed second in both the Intermediate 800 and 1600 metre events; and Bob Yip, who placed second in the Midget 800.

Pascoe whiffs 17 batters

MARKHAM Grant Pascoe hurled Greenwood to an 8-5 victory Tuesday night, over a much-improved Markham team.

Pascoe had superb control as he struck out seventeen batters and gave up only four bases on balls. The losers got full value for their six hits as they brought five runners home.

Center-fielder, Ken Young was alert on several plays which kept the Greenwood output in check. He earned two hits in four tries and picked up three RBI's. A home run in the second inning made him a temporary hero as it tied the score.

Bill Michell went all the way on the Markham mound allowing ten safeties and hurting his cause with nine free passes. Support came from short stop Harry Ellis who registered a pair of singles in four trips. Michell also had a good night at the dish as he duplicated Ellis' performance and also batted in one of the losers' five runs.

Greenwood were more steady than flashy as they sprinkled their runs over the nine inning route. After Markham evened the score in the second frame, the victors went ahead by two in the third and then did an encore in the fourth inning. Another two runners

crossed the plate in the seventh inning before Markham bounced back with three big runs to narrow the gap to 8-5. Time ran out as Pascoe

struck out five of the remaining six batters. A new acquisition, John Hill who has played recently for Brooklin had all the moves at second

base and did a creditable job with the lumber as he drove in two runs with as many hits.

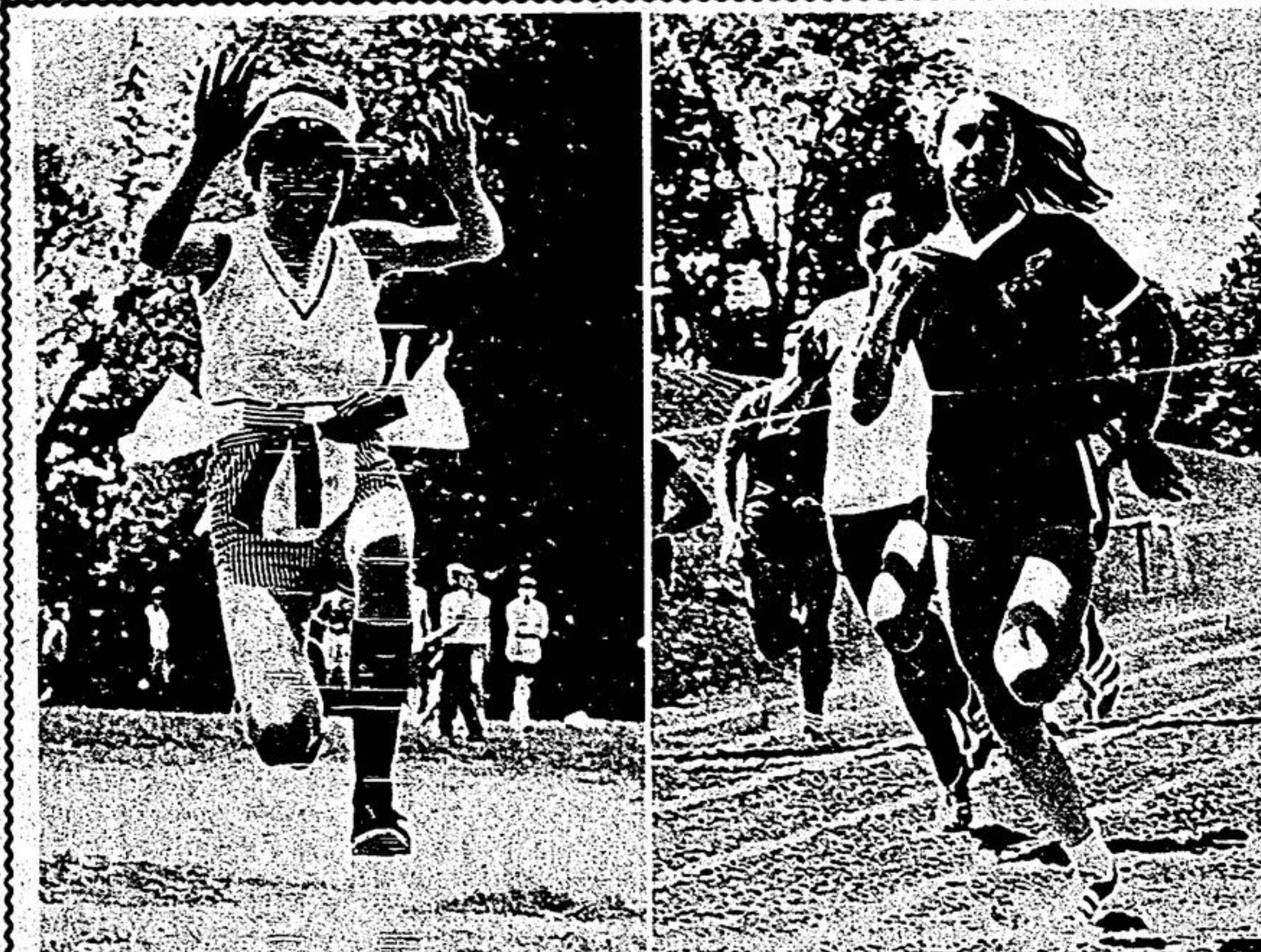

Bob Parish hurls 4-hitter

STOUFFVILLE - Stouffville's Intermediate entry in the South Ontario County Fastball League laid plenty of hickory to horsehide in the second inning to down Brougham 8-2. The local club, sponsored by Betz Pools, made a circuit of the batting order as they collected six runs on the same number of hits.

Bob Parish went all the way for the winners as he begrudged but four hits. Parish wasted few pitches as he made it a "three up and three down" situation in six of the nine innings. John Annis started on the mound for Brougham but left in favor of seventeen year old Roy Hooker after the batting bombardment. Still a Midget, Hooker got off to a rather shaky start giving up one run on two hits in the third. From then on he was unbeatable as the Stouffville crew failed to record a single hit.

In the errors department, Brougham had the edge with only one while the Betz Pool brigade committed three.

Wayne Crowder and Bruce Fockler made their single hits count as each drove in a pair of runs for Stouffville while Brian Emery had the best night with two hits in three official trips to the plate.
