

Single opponent to Pickering pay raise

Garbage collectors make more

PICKERING TWP. — Township council members have hoisted their pay with only one objector. Councillor Jean McPherson cast the only dissenting vote.

The reeve's salary goes up from \$9,058 to \$9,560 for 1970. This represents, Finance Chairman John Kruger reported, an 8.3 percent increase. He said it didn't represent any real purchasing power to the reeve.

The rate for the deputy reeve and councillors has been increased from \$18 to \$22 per meeting (\$22 is the maximum amount per day no matter how many meetings are held on that day). This is equal to the percentage increase granted the township staff in 1967. Kruger recommends that the per diem rate be increased each year by an amount no less than the yearly factor applicable to the inflationary cycle.

At the rate of 100 meetings a year, and with expenses, a councillor will gross between \$2,300 and \$2,500. The County Board of Education Trustee receives approximately \$1,000 more than this a year.

Mr. Kruger related the number of hours worked — one hour in council equalled one hour in preparation — and said that as a garbage collector, he would make more money than he does as a councillor.

Ratepayers had often become quite vocal about how much is paid a councillor, Kruger said, and generally with good cause, for historically the municipal level had not attracted the more competent citizens. The people who piously suggest that municipal officials should be paid only a token amount and that they should receive their reward solely out of a sense of public service, he said, have their heads in the sand.

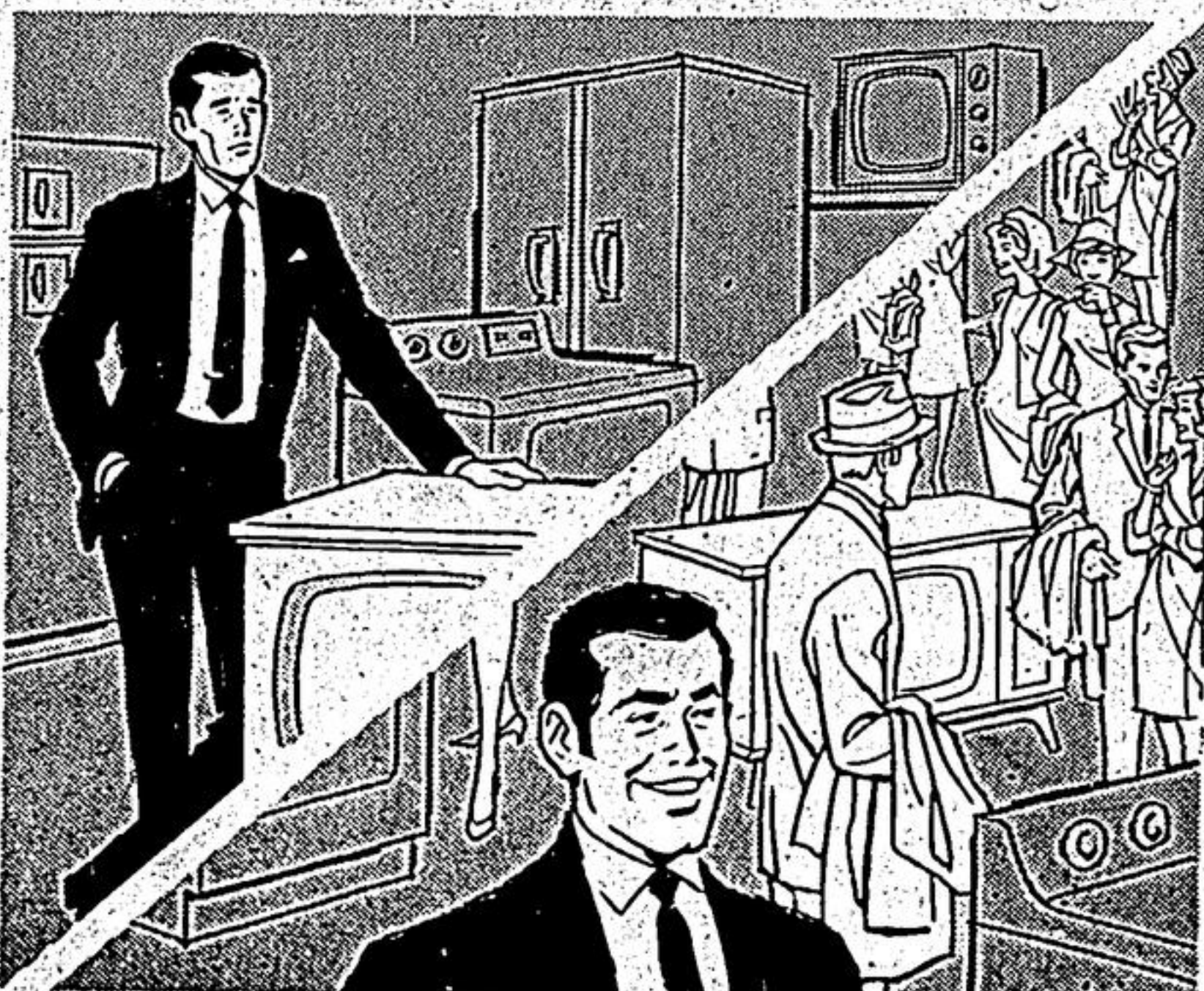
