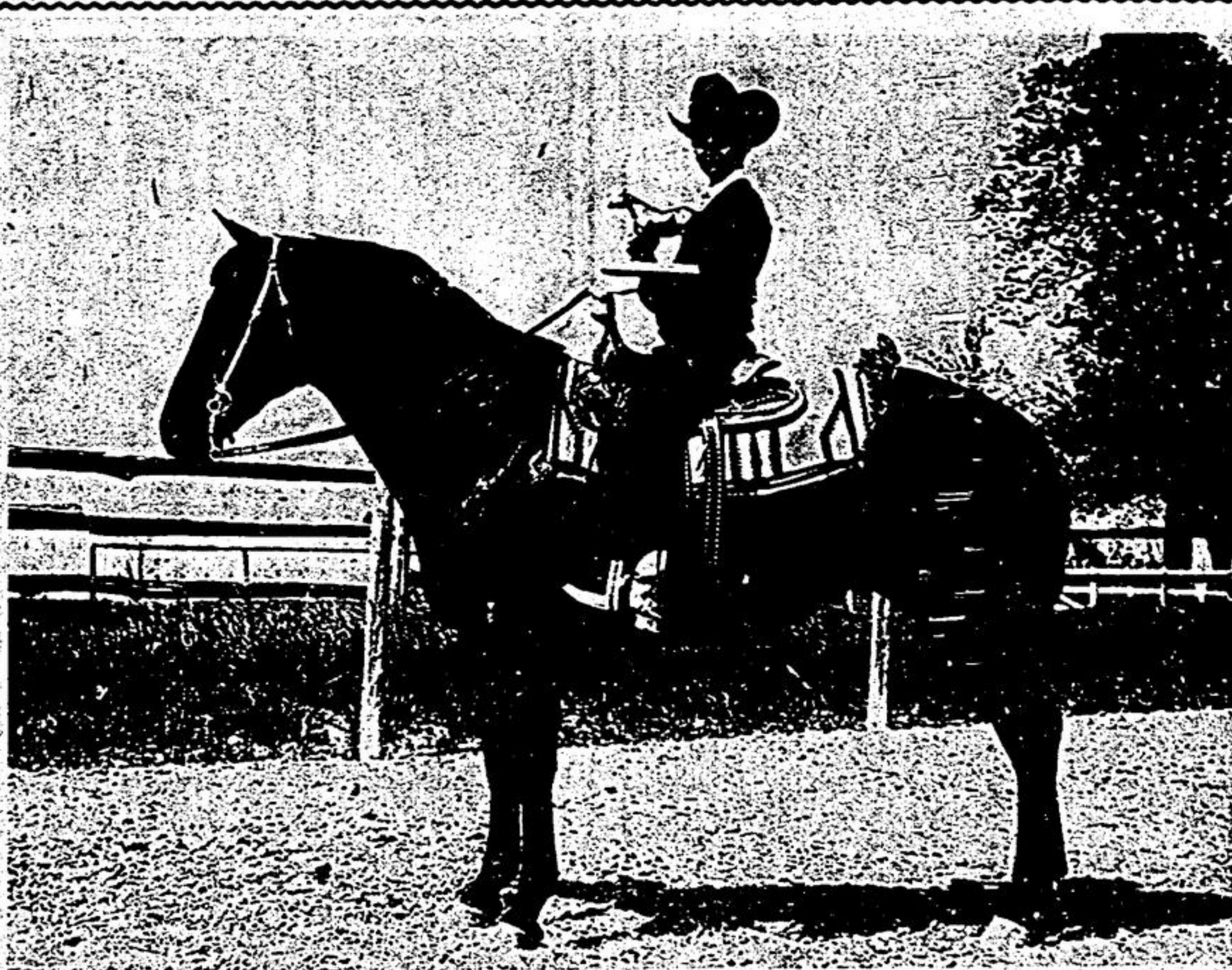


Students win fair trophy
