While the recipients of individual awards are listed elsewhere, fifty-two students attained honor standing of over 80 percent to qualify for an academic bar.

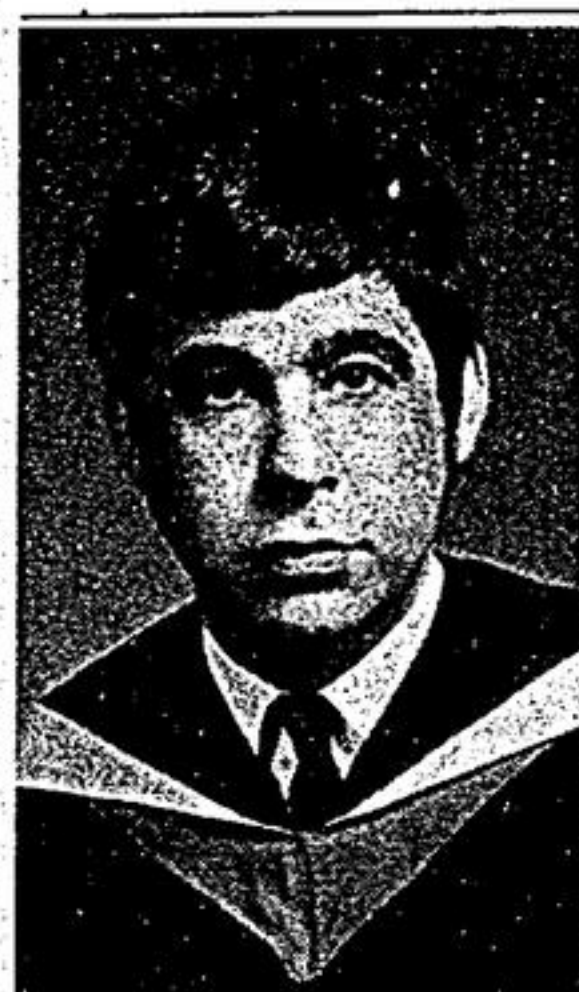
