

Ballantrae crash

WHITCHURCH TWP. Two Uxbridge area men were taken to York County Hospital, Newmarket, June 30, following a two-car crash at the intersection of Hwy. 48 and the Aurora Sideroad in Ballantrae.

Donald Phillips, 22, and a passenger in his car, Mike Phillips, 17, both of Uxbridge R.R.2, suffered contusions to the head. Their vehicle was involved in a collision with a station wagon driven by Alfred Barrett, 17, of Stouffville. Total damage is estimated at \$1,250. Investigation was carried out by Provincial Constable Robert Pegg. During the past week, officers from the Oak Ridges Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police investigated 51 motor vehicle collisions, with 31 persons injured and total damage estimated at \$48,060.00.

Trailer site — a mobile village

MUSSELMAN'S LAKE Summer living is undergoing many changes but none more dramatic than evidenced at Musselman's Lake. The Cedar Beach Trailer Park is an example. It has grown with the trend to camping. It now can provide 196 trailers with electricity and water and a sewage network connected to 123 of these sites. This 'village on wheels' is the resting place of units from 15 to 35 feet long, costing anywhere from \$2,000 to \$10,000.

Why is camping increasing at the rate of 13 percent each year across Ontario? Owner and operator of the Cedar Beach Trailer Park, Vern Davies has some of the answers. The rising cost of maintaining permanent cottages is one factor.

Increased motel, hotel and cottage rates is another. Large families on small budgets particularly feel the pinch. There also seems to be a trend away from vacationing in large cities and crowded resort areas in favor of the more natural settings provided by the improved campgrounds across the province.

Some of the campers stay only a day or two but many are residents from Victoria Day through to Thanksgiving. Violet and Fred Pfeiffer are just such a couple. Fred, a retired electrician and his wife live in a very comfortable, well equipped and fully serviced mobile home. After Thanksgiving, they will head for Seminole, Florida, just outside of St. Petersburg. They have wintered in Florida for the past seven years but always returned to their home in Richmond Hill — that is until the rising property taxes persuaded them to sell their home last year and give mobile living a try. "This is a fine place. We're also close enough to our family that they can visit us on weekends."
