### TOWNSHIP OF PICKERING 1970 REALTY TAXES

Please take note that the fourth instalment of the 1970 Realty Taxes is due and payable on or before August 4th, 1970. Allowing for the amount intermily billed, the remaining balance will become due as follows:

Fourth Instalment — August 4th  
Fifth Instalment — October 1st  
Sixth Instalment — December 1st

Realty tax bills will be mailed on or before July 21st, 1970.

**DISCOUNTS FOR PROMPT PAYMENT**  
A discount of 1% will be allowed on the final bill if paid in full before August 4th, 1970.

**PENALTIES FOR LATE PAYMENT**  
If there is a default in payment of any instalment by the due date named for payment thereof, the subsequent instalment or instalments shall become payable forthwith.

Penalties will be charged at the rate of 1% per calendar month or fraction thereof and will be added to each instalment of taxes commencing on the first day of default following the due date of each instalment.

The Province of Ontario's Municipal and School Tax Credit Assistance Act provides for a tax deferment if the home owner is sixty-five years of age or over. This Act enables the taxpayer to apply for a maximum deduction of \$150.00 per annum, or 50% of the total taxes.

### Two provincial awards

STOUFFVILLE — The Stouffville Kinsmen Club has copped two provincial awards for membership expansion. Increasing their roster from twenty-nine to forty-seven members in the past year earned them both Zone and District recognition. The former involved ten clubs in the Metro area, and the latter, a more prestigious honor, was taken from among seventy-five Kinsmen organizations in Ontario.
