Rush hour on Hwy. 48

Records 1,177 cars between 7 and 8 a.m.

MARKHAM — If you are among the many commuters who travel to and from Toronto daily, you may have wondered just how many motorists utilize the Hwy. 48 route. The figures, provided by regional consultants, Murray Jones and Associates Limited, limits the count to the area 1.2 miles south of the Hwy. 7 intersection. The survey was made Jan. 28 and 29, 1970. During the peak rush-hour period from 7 to 8 a.m. 1,177 vehicles passed

this point. In the afternoon, between 4 and 5 p.m., the number decreased to 1,043. The lightest traffic period was between 4 and 5 a.m. when the counter indicated 24. The number of vehicles utilizing Hwy. 7 and 48 corner is indicated by a 24 hour survey in March 1969, totalling 24,334. The report points out that by 1985, the amount of traffic at this intersection will be up 2 to 3 times its present volume.
